During the month of November, we continue our "Season of Thanks Giving" at Grace Covenant. Closely tied to that is our theme for the 2020 pledge drive – "Thanks Living."

Thanks "living" is not a season or a single holiday, but a way of life, a life of gratitude that all Christians are called to live. There are few things that will improve our lives as much as gratitude, and that begins by seeing the good around us.


East Hill Singers - November 10, 4pm

Concert on a Sunday at Grace Covenant

The East Hill Singers will perform at Grace Covenant Presbyterian Church on Sunday, November 10, 2019 at 4pm.

This article features information about that future event. This concert is one of four annual concerts presented in the Kansas City Metropolitan Area in 2019.

The East Hill Singers, from the Lansing State Correctional Facility, consists of inmates from the minimal correctional unit and community volunteers. Arts in Prison, the organization





Your presence at the concert is one way of showing the incarcerated person that people do appreciate this time of each singer's expression of art.

On the day of the concert, what should happen?

1pm The singers will rehearse in the Sanctuary.

3pm The singers will have a refreshment break in Heartland Hall.

3pm The art display opens. You may purchase items such as paintings by inmates, art prints, note cards, and any item labeled for sale.

4pm The concert begins.

About 5:30pm, after the concert, the singers will stand in a receiving line to share greetings from family, friends, and concert attendees. **About 6pm**, or before, the singers, prison officials, security

personnel, and concert planners will eat dinner in Heartland Hall. **After dinner**, the East Hill Singers will depart.

Listening and observing a concert by the East Hill Singers provide evidence of the restoration of hope among the singers who are incarcerated in at least three ways:

- 1. The concerts often feature presentations by inmate members to introduce a song. These words frequently relate the significance of the song to the presenter's current period of incarceration as a result of an act of committing a specific crime.
- 2. Some inmates, during these presentations, have joyfully expressed renewed hope for living successfully outside of prison walls due to experiences as a member of this choir.
- 3. After concerts, both incarcerated and community volunteers have related gratitude to concert attendees. Please attend the concert and bring others as a significant expression of hope.



Clerk's Corner

Session met on October 21, 2019 in room 5, with Reverend Mitch Trigger serving as moderator. In addition to the elders, Deacon Bob Dover, Reverend Sue Trigger and the confirmation students and mentors were present.

Consent agenda: The minutes of the September stated Session meeting and the motion from the Youth Team about the M&M fund raiser (the M&M Poster Palooza) were approved.

Team minutes: The Finance Team reported that it looks like the 2019 revenues will meet expenses. Pledge Sunday will be October 27 (the same day as Trunk or Treat). Rev. Mitch reported on the Stewardship Conference he attended in San Diego. He recommends separating the Finance Team from the Generosity Team because they require different tasks and timeframes. Some experts recommend asking members to pledge things besides just money. One important aspect was to do mission work outside the building, in order to serve the greater community and connect with others. We congratulated the Mission Team on the success of Workship Sunday, which engaged a broad spectrum of the congregation. The Mission Team is going to analyze our present mission projects and decide how to reorganize any that are not going smoothly.

Clerk's report: Our membership is stable at 487.

Co-Pastors' report: There were no questions about the co-pastors' report.

Deacons' report: Bob Dover reported that the deacons are calling inactive members and reporting back to the Connections & Care Team via Kathy Williams.

Old business: Nominating Team – Harold Frye reported that the Nominating Team is at work seeking deacon candidates, though they have a deacon moderator. Tim Hayden volunteered to be the second elder on the team. Worship attendance - Nelson Townsend shared the latest statistics on worship attendance. There has been a decline at both services. What do we do with this information? Rev. Sue suggested this would be a good discussion at Visioning Day. Operations Manual - Rev. Sue sent out a draft copy of the updated Operations Manual. Session members are asked to show it to their teams and mark any needed changes.

New business: There was no new business.

After sharing some joys and concerns of the congregation, the meeting was adjourned at 8:56 p.m. and Rev. Mitch closed the meeting with a prayer.

Mission Team

November Communion and Donation Partner

The November Communion Offering collection and our donation partner is the Red Bag Christmas Program.

As is our tradition for many years, we will be collecting gifts to be donated to children within the foster care system. You may select a Post-It note with the name of a child (or more than one) from the stockings in the hallway when they appear on November 17, then shop for the child you have chosen and return the gift-wrapped gifts by the due date of December 8.

The Presbyterian Women Thank Offering will be collected in November.

This program began in 1888! Your gifts will help fund 18 of the projects that were selected this year out of 75 requests. Grant requests include Room at the Inn from Giddings/Lovejoy Presbytery. Room at the Inn serves families who had been living in their car, spending nights in a park, or squatting in an abandoned building. They stay for up to 30 days and get assistance in identifying needs, setting goals, accessing services, finding housing, securing employment and becoming more self-sufficient. The Thank Offering will help replace outdated equipment that is essential for serving Room at the Inn's homeless clientele.

The Thanksgiving Eve offering will be collected for Gifts of Grace, an "In-reach" program of Grace Covenant to help members who are facing financial stress.

Grace Covenant will host Johnson County Interfaith Hospitality Network (IHN) homeless guests during the week of November 3-10.

You don't have to be a trained chef to help with providing food for our guests. If your covenant group is responsible for providing food this week, please be supportive of your deacon as they organize the effort to feed our IHN guests.

An Intergenerational Advent Fair Sunday, December 1, 10am in Heartland Hall

The Season of Advent is rich with meaning and we're going to ask "Why?" Sunday, December 1st. Each worship service will include special moments that will explain a bit about some of our favorite traditions.

During the Sunday school hour (10am in Heartland Hall), we will have an Intergenerational Advent Fair. Come learn more about Chrismons and Advent calendars, Advent wreaths, the nativity and more. Each activity site will have information and activities for everyone to enjoy.

Thank Offering 2019

Presbyterian Women founded two special offerings, The Birthday Offering and Thank Offering.

Typically the Thank Offering is considered a fall offering. Many churches include the entire congregation to participate in this offering as Grace Covenant is doing in November.

Look for the blue envelope in the pew holder. Write your check to GCPC, put in blue envelope and place in collection plate.

The PW offering committee selected 18 of 75 applicants to fund: 12 serve programs in the US; 6 are international; 40% of the projects are related to health ministries.

Two were selected from the Synod of Mid-America, which is the synod for Grace Covenant. \$24,250 will support Room at the Inn to make safety upgrades to a facility for homeless clientele in the Giddings-Lovejoy Presbytery.

The other one will give \$25,000 to Walking Together, a program that helps newly arrived immigrants and refugees in their new American community with food, clothing, utility bills, learning English, and finding employment in Heartland Presbytery.
