We're going to wrap up the Season of Peace at Grace Covenant on Sunday, October 6, when we observe World Communion/Peace & Global Witness Sunday.

The following Sunday, October 13, begins something new – our Season of Thanks Giving, a time for us to give special consideration for all that we *are* thankful for in our lives - and we are very blessed. The theme for this year is "Thanks Living."

It's not a new idea. In an essay called "The Art of Living," Wilfred Peterson wrote:

The art of thanksgiving is thanks-living. It is gratitude in action.... It is thanking God for the gift of life by living it triumphantly.... It is thanking God for opportunities by accepting them as a challenge to achievement.... It is thanking God for inspiration by living to be an inspiration to others.... It is adding to your prayers of thanksgiving, acts of thanks-living. [The Art of Living (New York: Simon and Schuster, 1961), pp. 44–45]

But in our hearts, is there sufficient thankfulness to really give praise to our generous God? Does this thankfulness result in showing any true gratitude?

Do we do any more than say a thanksgiving prayer over the traditional Thanksgiving feast? Or are some of our prayers and our lives like those described by the Scottish poet Robert Burns— "Three mile prayers and one-half mile graces"?

Have we learned to *say* thank you and to *show* thank you?

I like these words—they remind us that to be truly thankful calls for living out that thankfulness:

If you hear a kind word spoken Of some worthy soul you know, It may fill his heart with sunshine If you'd only tell him so.

If a deed, however humble, helps you On your way to go, Seek the one whose hand has helped you. Seek her out and tell her so.

If your heart is touched and tender Toward a sinner lost and low, *It might help him to do better* If you would only tell him so. [Anonymous]

Take a Look at What's Happening in Sunday School!

East Hill Singers - November 10, 4pm

Concert on a Sunday at Grace Covenant

The East Hill Singers will perform at Grace Covenant Presbyterian Church on Sunday, November 10, 2019 at 4pm. This article features information about that future event. This concert is one of four annual concerts presented in the Kansas City Metropolitan Area in 2019.

The East Hill Singers, from the Lansing State Correctional Facility, consists of inmates from the minimal correctional unit and community volunteers. Arts in Prison, the organization that sponsors the East Hill Singers, identifies them as one



of its premiere programs. Offering classes and programs about the arts, serve as major strategies for Arts in Prison to achieve a stated purpose: "... provides life changing programs using art as a medium to inspire positive change in the incarcerated to reduce recidivism and to connect offenders to their communities." According to Arts in Prison, inmates frequently report that the programs help them find hope that they can grow, change, and live productively outside of prison. Examples of program classes include music, painting, photography, public speaking, and drama.

Your presence at the concert is one way of showing the incarcerated person that people do appreciate this time of each singer's expression of art.

On the day of the concert, what should happen?

- 1pm The singers will rehearse in the Sanctuary.
- **3pm** The singers will have a refreshment break in Heartland Hall.
- 3pm The art display opens. You may purchase items such as paintings by inmates,
- art prints, note cards, and any item labeled for sale.
- 4pm The concert begins.

About 5:30pm, after the concert, the singers will stand in a receiving line to

share greetings from family, friends, and concert attendees.

About 6pm, or before, the singers, prison officials, security personnel, and concert planners will eat dinner in Heartland Hall.

After dinner, the East Hill Singers will depart.

Please consider attending the concert. You may want to volunteer for an activity.

All activities will help to make the concert operationally efficient, beautiful, and meaningful to the East Hill Singers, you, and concert participants. One of the ways that you can indicate your specific volunteer work request involves using the computer to "sign-up." Watch for this sign-up.

Remember to invite your neighbors.

Clerk's Corner

Session met on September 16, 2019 in room 5, with Reverend Sue Trigger serving as moderator. In addition to the elders, Deacon Barb Brown, and Reverend Mitch Trigger were present. Consent agenda: The minutes of the August stated Session meeting, the motion to start a GCPC runners group, offering the pulpit to Kate Trigger Duffert on September 1 (voted on via e-mail beforehand) and holding a Blessing of the Animals on October 5 were approved.

Team minutes: Teams were encouraged to submit minutes from meetings to Patrick in time for him to send them out with the Session materials (the Thursday before Session). There was a discussion about the upcoming budget procedures. While we are trying to maintain the budget without increases, teams are encouraged to ask for the funds to fulfill their mission. If teams have guestions about line items in their budget, they are asked to call Tara. Rev. Sue mentioned that we need to have procedures and policies stated in the Operations Manual. A revised manual will be sent to Session members soon so they can review it with their teams. The Operating Committee submitted a procedure to follow to update the membership rolls. Nelson Townsend asked that Session pray for people whose name appears on the list. Session approved the new procedure, as well as a letter to be sent to inactive members, and directed the church office to start the procedure.

Clerk's report: Our membership is stable at 487.

Co-Pastors' report: Mitch will be attending a stewardship conference at the end of the month. Patrick will be on vacation the end of October and has asked that bulletin announcements be submitted by September 24.

Deacons' report: Barb Brown reported that the deacons had a get-together in August. Rev. Sue pointed out that the Operating Committee discussed having the deacons develop procedures for meals and visits. Cheryl Johnson sent Barb a copy of the Operating Committee minutes.

Old business: Harold Frye reported that the Nominating Team is at work seeking deacon candidates. Rev. Sue pointed out that we still need another elder on the team.

New business: Session approved a motion to create a safety and security team to prepare procedures. Session approved hosting the September 19, 2020, Presbytery meeting. Nelson Townsend and Diane Schmit distributed graphs showing worship attendance. We need to talk to members who are not attending and get some feedback. Discussion highlighted several points to talk about during Visioning Day. Members are reminded that personal invitations are the best way to bring visitors to church.

After sharing some joys and concerns of the congregation, the meeting was adjourned at 8:32pm, and Rev. Sue closed the meeting with a prayer.

Mission Team

October Communion and Donation Partner

The October communion offering will be directed to two organizations that provide health care to low-income and uninsured residents of Wyandotte and Johnson Counties.

The Duschene Clinic is a doctors' office in Wyandotte County that provides primary health care, medication assistance, and chronic disease management.

The Health Partnership of Johnson County is Johnson County's largest safety-net clinic for low-income and uninsured residents of Johnson County, and the only one providing care free of charge to this population. In addition to the communion offering, we are collecting over the counter medications to help stock both clinics, including large bottles of Tylenol, Aleve, Advil, aspirin and cold/cough type medications. Generic or store brands are fine and less expensive. Please place your donations in the bin in the Weekday Entrance.

A little bit about Friends of JCDS...

Our primary outward mission partner on "Workship Sunday," October 20, is Friends of JCDS (Johnson County Developmental Supports).

Friends of JCDS, Inc. ensures that individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities are successful in our communities. They remove barriers to affordable, accessible housing and help with basic needs for individuals who receive support from Johnson County Developmental Supports. By helping with these core obstacles, they ensure that individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities in Johnson County can be successful in our community as active and engaged members.

They assist individuals in a variety of ways, but one of the most important is housing. Friends of JCDS, Inc. owns 13 homes (*they will open a 14th in a couple of weeks*) that have been remodeled to meet universal design standards. What does that mean? A ramp that allows egress. Widened doorways and hallways. Bathrooms that are accessible. Their housing assistance for individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities served by Johnson County Developmental Supports keeps their rent well below market value so individuals can afford to live in our community. We look forward to helping support, in some small way, such a wonderful endeavor.

- Corporate and Public Policy Witness: advocating and campaigning for changes in policies and practices to end hunger and its causes, promote self-development, and care for creation. We encourage members to write local, regional and national representatives advocating for policies that consider all of God's creation!
- Worship: incorporating prayer, education, and preaching about ending hunger and its causes into worship. Study, pray, and share with others the charge to care for the least of these.

Thanks to your session Grace Covenant was recognized as a PCUSA hunger Action Congregation 2018–2020 by demonstrating a commitment to follow Christ's example in helping to alleviate hunger and eliminate it's causes.


