"Christmas time is here..."

Well, not really. Christmas Day is December 25, but there is also a time period in the church liturgical year known as Christmastide. It begins at sunset on Christmas Eve and runs through the evening of January 5, Epiphany Eve (also known as Twelfth Night). And so, Christmastide is the 12 days of Christmas. Epiphany is January 6 and is not part of Christmastide, but it is celebrated as the revelation of Jesus to the non-Jewish world (as represented by the Magi).

We'll bet this is news to many of us. For most of the next month, we'll be observing Advent (Dec. 1 through daylight on Dec. 24). Advent comes from Latin and means "coming." It's a time when we remember that the world was waiting for the birth of Jesus, and it's a time when we prepare our hearts for the time when Jesus comes again into the world.

One of the challenges today is that Christmas has become more than just a religious observance. Many of us feel that the "Christ" has gone out of "Christmas," and children associate the holiday more with Santa Claus than Jesus. There are different ways of responding to this. One, do our best to keep the secular aspects of Christmas at arm's length. Another is to take the time to educate, explain, and understand where the message of Jesus is found in the celebration of Christmas in today's culture.

We'll be doing some of that last approach during our Advent exploration of the classic Advent themes of peace, hope, joy and love. "Because of our God's deep compassion, the dawn from heaven will break upon us, to give light to those who are sitting in darkness and in the shadow of death, to guide us on the path of peace." (Luke 1:78-79)

Presbyterians Around the World

Update on H.R. 6207 — Democratic Republic of the Congo Democracy and Accountability Act of 2018



Christi and Jeff Boyd, two of our

Mission Co-workers, assigned to the Democratic Republic of the Congo (DRC), do act to facilitate the provision of humanitarian support to people in the DRC. This article focuses only on the facts related to the current status of H.R. 6207.

H. R.6207 urges the President to support efforts at the United Nations "with respect to the humanitarian and political crisis in the DRC, (2) provides statutory authority sanctions related to the Congo, and (3) requires the Department of the State to report on human rights abuses and corruption there."

The bill does contain references for the inclusion of faith-based organizations in the implementation of this bill. For example, Sec 2. (b) (1) reads "promoting partnerships with organizations that have had a long-term presence in the country and have achieved measurable impact including ... faith-based organizations ... to address local needs."

Latest Action: On November 28, 2018, the bill was received in the Senate (three versions), read twice and referred to the Committee on Foreign Relations. The bill was introduced and passed by the House. The Bill has had 1 roll call vote.

Pew Dwellers' Health Notes

Salt

An explanation of the expression "Salt of the Earth" introduces this article. The information that follows includes:

- 1. An explanation about the body's need for salt.
- 2. Daily requirements for salt for individuals who have no restrictions due to potential

or existing changes in health status.

- 3. Excessive use of salt as a risk factor for the development of specific diseases.
- 4. Changes in behavior to help reduce the daily intake of salt.

The Bible contains many references to salt. One Biblical resource listed 40 references about salt which included a scripture that referred to eating and using salt. Job states in Job 6:6–7, "Can something tasteless be eaten without salt. Or is there any taste in the white of an egg? My soul refuses to touch them. They are like loathsome food to me." Some Biblical experts write that some of the scriptures about salt are metaphors or words used to represent or serve as symbols for something else.

In Matthew 5:13 (NLT), the scripture states, "You are the salt of the earth. But what good is salt if it has lost its flavor? Can you make it salty again? It will be thrown out and trampled underfoot as worthless." Some of the Biblical experts state that «... the disciples were not literally the salt ... the salt is preservative ... the disciples have a life preserving influence on the people ..." Easton's Bible Dictionary noted the use of salt to season food and serve as a measure of hospitality, "to eat salt with one is to partake of his hospitality, to derive subsistence from him."

Part II of this article will begin with the topic on the body's need for salt.

Clerk's Corner

Session met on Nov. 18, 2019 in room 5, with Reverend Sue Trigger serving as moderator. In addition to the elders, Deacon Meredith Watson, Reverend Mitch Trigger and several new members were present.

Special business: Session welcomed and, after hearing their faith histories, approved the following as new members: Pam Hearn, Rebecca Chase, Paul and Linda Bruns, Kinsey and Casey Kudrna, and Bob Wilhite.

Consent agenda: The minutes of the October stated Session meeting, as well as a few membership requests, were approved (membership is 482).

Team minutes: The Personnel Team submitted a motion identifying Dec. 26, 2019, as a holiday for the church staff, as well as the dates for 2020. The team also submitted a motion asking Session to approve position descriptions for the co-pastors. Both motions were approved by Session.

The Finance Team submitted a motion asking Session to approve the 2020 Asking Budget. Aaron Soule reported that the budget allows GCPC to meet expenses, including significant facilities improvements, without holding a capital campaign. It is hoped that members will consider that when they make their pledges. Session approved the Asking Budget.

The Connections and Care Team submitted a list of members who have not attended worship in at least a year. The list has been reviewed by the staff and the deacons, as well as the Connections and Care Team. The team submitted a motion that Session approve proceeding with sending letters to these members asking if they want to remain on the membership rolls. If no positive reply is received, they will be removed from the rolls. After reviewing the list, Session approved starting the process.

The Facilities Team asked about the procedure for starting the electric heater that melts ice off the sidewalk in front of the church. After discussion, it was decided that more information was needed.

Clerk's report: After approving the requests of five members to be removed, we have 482 members. (*This number will change significantly after the letter-writing process is completed.*)

Co-Pastors' report: There were no questions about the co-pastors' report.

Deacons' report: Meredith Watson reported the deacons have been hard at work trying to contact members on the list. She also reported that the deacons will not be organizing the KCK Hot Lunch service starting in 2020. Instead, members will be able to sign up for the month that meets their schedule.

Old business: Nominating Team – Harold Frye reported that the Nominating Team almost has all the deacon candidates. Session approved scheduling a congregational meeting on December 22 to elect the deacons.

New business: 2020 Presbytery Dates – February 22, April 21, June 13, September. 19 (at GCPC) and November 17. Operations Manual – Session approved the updated Operations Manual, as well as two new policies. The first is an alcohol policy which states that GCPC doesn't permit alcohol consumption on the premises (except for the sacrament of Communion) unless approved by the Session on a case by case basis. The other new policy states that, when a team wants to invite a guest preacher, requests with information about the presenter shall be submitted to the Worship Team for approval. Workship Sunday – Session approved holding a Workship Sunday on April 26, Earth Day.

After sharing some joys and concerns of the congregation, the meeting was adjourned at 8:41 p.m. and Rev. Sue closed the meeting with a prayer.
