Music Leadership in August

August brings both the close of our summer music season and the first signs of an exciting fall ahead. Throughout the month, we will hear from familiar ensembles, individual musicians, and members of the Music Team as we celebrate the many ways music brings us together and supports the worship life of GCPC.

August 2 - We begin the month with Summer Choir singing *You Are Not Alone* by Molly Ijames. Originally commissioned to honor the many years of service given by former Director of Music Ministries Rebecca Prater, this meaningful anthem is sure to become a Sunday staple and congregational favorite.

The morning will also feature Esme Dixon singing Audrey Assad's *I Shall Not Want* and Cal Sweeten sharing the distinctive and beautiful sound of the dulcimer. Together, these musical offerings will help frame a special "Music from the Field" conversation from members of the Music Team about what we do, how we serve the church, and the many ways music strengthens our worship and congregational life.

August 9 - Our attention turns toward the beginning of a new school and ministry season as we celebrate the Ministry Fair and Blessing of the Backpacks. The Praise Team will help lead a morning centered on new beginnings, shared ministry, and the assurance of God's presence wherever the coming season may lead us.

August 16 - At the heart of our August worship will be César Franck's beloved *Panis Angelicus* from *Mass, Op. 12*, sung by Patrick O'Halloran. Its gentle melody and prayerful text invite us to pause and reflect on Christ's presence and the grace that continues to nourish and sustain us.

August 23 - As summer begins giving way to fall, the Praise Team returns to help us mark this season of transition. Through our shared music, prayer, and song, we will prepare to reconnect with one another and enter the fall with renewed purpose.

August 30 - We close the month by welcoming Chancel Choir back to worship with *Just a Closer Walk with Thee*, arranged by Ed Lojeski. Rooted in the beloved gospel hymn, this joyful prayer for God's guidance is a fitting way to begin another season of making music and leading worship together.

Chancel Choir Returns

Before returning to worship on August 30, Chancel Choir will gather for its first rehearsal of the season on Wednesday, August 26, from 7:05–8:30pm.

New and returning singers are always welcome. We are grateful for every voice, the commitment choir members

offer throughout the year, and the genuine community that grows through making music together. We look forward to seeing familiar faces, welcoming new ones, and beginning another meaningful season.

Youth Music Returns This Fall!

That spirit of renewal will continue into the fall as **Spirit Singers and Spirit Ringers** return after a long time away. This fresh start gives our young people new opportunities to make music, grow together, and take an active role in leading our congregation in worship.

Spirit Singers is open to middle school students and will rehearse during the Sunday School hour on the dates listed below. **Spirit Ringers**, directed by Katie Hearn, welcomes both middle and high school students and will meet from 12:00–12:30pm in Room 1. No previous handbell experience is necessary.

Both groups will prepare to help lead worship on October 25 and December 6 through two four-week rehearsal rounds. Young musicians may participate in the round that works best for their schedules or join us for both.

- Rehearsals: September 27 and October 4, 11, and 18
- Worship leadership: October 25

Round 2

- Rehearsals: November 8, 15, 22, and 29
- Worship leadership: December 6
- Christmas Ex! Concert: December 6 at 6:00pm

Because the music develops from week to week, **Spirit Ringers participants should attend at least three rehearsals during each round in which they participate.** Regular attendance allows the ensemble to learn together and approach worship leadership with confidence. Spirit Singers participants are also encouraged to attend regularly as their music takes shape throughout each round.

Movie Night, August 14, 6pm

Join us for KAIROS Movie Night on Friday, August 14 at 6pm in the Choir Room. Come watch "The Genesis of Exodus", a PCUSA, thought-provoking documentary exploring the realities of Central American immigration and the journeys that lead families to seek safety and hope. All too common, the rhetoric in the United States frames the arrival of Central American migrants as a story that begins at the U.S./Mexico border. This film dives into a much deeper and more complicated journey that begins in the homes, schools, and streets of Central American towns.

Following the film, stay for a Q&A and panel discussion with local advocates who work alongside our immigrant sisters and brothers in our community. Hear their stories, ask questions, and discover ways we can respond with compassion, understanding, and faith.

What Is Per Capita?

Per Capita is an amount paid per adult member of every PC(USA) congregation across the United States. It is a way we are the church together, and the local congregations support the work of the Presbytery, the Synod, and the General Assembly. While we have a line item in the budget for this expense, it helps our operating budget when members pay their per capita.

For 2026, the total cost per adult member is \$45.91.

That is split between the three higher governing bodies as follows: Heartland Presbytery \$31.50; Synod of Mid-America \$3.15; General Assembly \$11.26.

There is a drop-down selection for per capita on our website if you choose to pay online. Navigate to the "Pay online" link or view the "Online Giving" tab. If you would like to write a check, please write Per Capita in the memo line. Per Capita is an annual payment. If you have already submitted this year, thank you so much!

Reports from the Field: *Celebrating the Ministries That Shape Our Life Together*

Throughout the series, members of various ministry teams shared not only what they do, but why they do it. These conversations offered a deeper look at the heart behind our ministries and reminded us that the work of the church is more than programs, meetings, and tasks. Every ministry is a response to God's grace and a way we participate in God's ongoing work in the world.

The "Reports from the Field" series invited us to remember that every ministry has a story. In each conversation, teams reflected on what drew them into their work, where they have experienced joy and hope, and where they see God moving. They shared the challenges they encounter, the surprises that have emerged, and the ways their ministries continue to grow and adapt.

The series also encouraged us to ask important questions as a congregation: Why does this ministry matter? How does it help us live out our calling as followers of Christ? Where might each of us find a place to participate, serve, or offer support?

From caring for one another through Care & Connections and the Deacons, to creating meaningful worship experiences through the Worship and Music Team; from stewarding our resources through Finance and Generosity, to caring for our shared spaces through the Facilities Team; from nurturing faith across generations through Adult, Youth, and Children's Ministries, to seeking justice and building relationships through KAIROS and the work of our Mission Team — each group shared a glimpse of how God is at work through the people of Grace Covenant.

As we listened to these "reports," we were reminded that ministry is not something done by a select few. It is the shared calling of the whole congregation. Each of us has gifts, passions, and experiences that can help strengthen the life and mission of our church.

As our fall ministries begin, may we carry forward the stories we have heard and continue to look for the places where God is inviting us to serve, connect, and grow together.

- **3-4, Workshop rotation shepherds.** Our shepherds escort our classes to the rotation of the week and help supervise activities planned by our workshop rotation teacher.
- We also welcome **substitute Sunday School teachers** to be added to our call list when a need arises. Substitutes are used for all age levels.
- **Our ATW program is looking for additional storytellers or greeters** to assist with our children's worship service experience. You will be asked to sign up for one or more Sundays as your schedule permits. Storyteller training will happen on August 2, but if you aren't able to make it but are still interested, let us know.
- Our **SMASH program** (K-5th grade Fellowship) that meets on one Sunday a month from 4-6pm **needs 3-4 adults** to help set-up, supervise, and participate in activities with our children.
