

Clerk's Corner August 2022

After a two-month summer hiatus, Session met on August 15, 2022.

Over the summer some unidentified cremains were found in the church. After unsuccessfully reaching out to anyone who might be able to identify them, we held a Memorial Service for this unknown person and scattered the ashes in the Memorial Garden prior to our meeting.

Several teams have been discussing how their work ties into Grace Covenant's Core Values. All teams are asked to do this and we will aggregate that information.

Our insurance carrier has not paid as much for the HVAC repairs/replacement as we had anticipated, so we will be using \$58,350 from our Reserve Fund to pay the remainder as continue to pursue additional reimbursement from the insurance company. As a result of this draw down, we will resume adding \$3000/month into our reserve fund knowing that we will have additional costly repairs in the future. Please talk to a member of finance team if you have questions.

The August 7 offering was not immediately taken to the safe and disappeared. Extensive searches have been made (including the dumpster). The same night, several doors to the church were found to be unlocked (including the two near the chancel). Everyone is asked to be cognizant about open/unlocked doors.

We discussed procedures for locking up the church on Sunday mornings which will ensure the building is safe, but also respect people's time.

New Elder Liaison assignments to teams were distributed.

The Reynolds/Baker golf tournament is shaping up nicely.

Concerns were shared about ensuring that the Stewardship campaign goes smoothly this year, we celebrated the MANY ways that GCPC members care for each other and the community, and we thanked Susan Sutherland, Diane Schmit, and Mike Mattix for their service as they retire from the Session.














News About Our Artists in Residence: ENCOREKC!
