Our IHN Executive Director, Vicki Dercher wrote: Each of you have shared the gift of your love with our past and current guest families. Your gifts of time, talents and treasures have lifted up and lightened the load of **502 children**, **and 94 single women**. As of April 2023, your combined gifts of time, talents and treasures, have lifted up **875 total individuals**. Our IHN Family has provided **56,602 bednights**, **and 169,806 meals**. Generosity Team Update For Good – Living in God's Grace

We are about 30% through our 2023 calendar year and we wanted to give you an update on our pledge progress. Most years we feel that our financial giving starts to stabilize after the first three months, so we don't usually take a detailed look til about April. As of April 11, 2023 for the 101 submitted pledges, we have received about 35% (\$187,129) of their total \$533,192 commitment. Of the 28 Rollover pledges we have received about 15% (\$15,480) of their total \$101,369 commitment. We use 5 groupings to show giving progress and calendar relationship. They are 0%, 1-25%, 26-50%, 51-75%, 76-100%. Each pledge percentage progress falls into one of these groups.


As you can see, our pledged giving is a bit varied. We are hoping to see our 0% fulfilled numbers start moving into the other groups. We are also deep into preparing for Vacation Bible School guided by our planning team. Grace Covenant Children's Team is proud of our Awakening to Worship (ATW) program as coordinated by Kristy Shaw. ATW is a worship service for our four-year-olds through first graders. Children learn Bible stories and are encouraged to connect those Bible stories to their own lives. They learn about the church calendar and traditions and participate in worship practices such as the feast (communion).

SMASH stands for service, music, art, sports, and hangout. SMASH takes place once a month and is overseen by the Children's Team with the bulk of the planning being done by Christy Soule in conjunction with Sue Trigger. SMASH is a chance for the kids to get together outside of Sunday School to learn more about the love of God. Children's Ministry Opportunities

Awakening to Worship is our wonder and worship program for children ages 4-1st grade and meets following the children's sermon weekly. We invite children in elementary school to continue participating and experiencing worship as they move into the sanctuary for worship with the wider family of Grace Covenant.

Worship Bags are in place to help busy hands and hearts. Worship Bulletins are available from the ushers every week and are on two age levels.

Joy! Singers: Our 4 year olds – 1st grade children enjoy singing under the leadership of Emily Hussey and Hilary Schmidt.

Celebration! Choir: Pam Smith Kelly, Lara Schesser, and Angela Krug bring their talents to leading the Celebration! Choir. The children are not only singing; they are ringing chimes!

SMASH: Once a month, SMASH happens! We ordinarily meet the third Sunday of the month from 4-6pm in Heartland Hall. This popular program is an activity for kindergarten through 5/6th graders combining sports, music, arts, service, and "hangout" time and offers a time for children to be nurtured in faith by building relationships with a variety of adults of all ages.

Clerk's Corner

At the April Session meeting, we visited with members of Heartland Presbytery's Commission on Ministry (our first "triennial" visit in about 13 years). We discussed many of the strengths of our congregation as well as some of our challenges.
