We can send up to eight people on **Tuesday, November 18, 9am–3pm**. Registration closes at 12pm on Friday, November 7. You'll get an email after registering inviting you to complete the

volunteer application. This must be complete by the deadline! Spots are on a first-come, first-served basis, so don't wait until the last minute.

The workday is from 9am–3pm, with a 30-minute onsite lunch break. Bring your own lunch and a full water bottle (extra water will be available on site).

- Construction volunteers do not need to have any prior experience in construction or bring any of their own tools; we will give you all of the education and tools you need!
- All registered volunteers will receive their assignment location via automated e-mail three days prior to the volunteer day.
- In case of inclement weather, please call our Weather Hotline at 816-897-7799 to hear the recorded message for any cancellations or changes. We update the message by 7:15am each morning.
- We ask that all volunteers stay the full day, from 8:30am to 3pm
- We will have 30 minutes set aside for lunch time. You will need to provide your own lunches. Feel free to bring your lunch or have lunch delivered to the site.
- We highly recommend you bring a water bottle with you.
- Please wear clothes you don't mind getting dirt, mud or house paint on, and wear sturdy/closed toe and heeled shoes (NO flip flops, sandals or crocs!) If you have work gloves, please bring them.
- Dress for the weather. If there has been rain on previous days, be prepared for the sites to be muddy.
- The use, purchase and possession of alcohol, drugs and weapons are forbidden on Habitat KC property and volunteer sites.
- All volunteers must be 16 or older to volunteer. Volunteers under 18 must be accompanied by a parent or guardian.

NOMINATING

THE NOMINATING COMMITTEE is looking for four new deacons beginning January 2026. The Deacon Ministry is about compassion, witness and service. Deacons serve a 3-year term. Each deacon is entrusted with a Covenant Group, comprising about a dozen families or individuals. Deacons play a vital role in congregational care by connecting members to the life of the church and by fostering relationships. Each deacon along with his or her covenant group is linked with two other covenant groups referred to as Deacon Pods. Deacons do things such as arrange meals for members in need, acknowledge celebrations and simply work to keep members in touch with one another. Each Deacon Pod helps once a quarter, with Sunday hosting and greeting. Deacons currently sponsor two church-wide social events: the Brunch Potluck in February and the Church Picnic in the late summer. Sometimes deacons will choose to host smaller social events as a way to further build connections among members. There is a 90-minute training session for new deacons in January and six, one-hour meetings per year, currently held the first Sunday of even months following worship.
