A Note From the Steens

Thank you for your prayers for the family of our close friend's three-month-old baby boy, Benjamin Aaron. The harsh reality of Benjamin's death is that his loss was due to positional asphyxiation while sleeping in his parent's bed. After researching data on this type of loss, the below information is from one of many websites that speaks to the unfortunate statistics of cosleeping with babies up to a year. While SIDS deaths have been reduced over past years, co-sleeping deaths have increased at an alarming rate. David and I want to encourage our congregation to share the dangers of co-sleeping with your family and friends in remembrance of this sweet baby boy. Help us save precious lives!

After analyzing data on 8,207 infant deaths from 24 states that occurred between 2004 and 2012, researchers determined that nearly 74 percent of deaths in babies younger than 4 months occurred in a bed-sharing situation, according to the study published Monday in Pediatrics. Among older infants - those aged 4 months to 364 days - the rate was slightly lower at nearly 59 percent. Discovering the Arapaho:

Part V

Steve Newcomb, in the 1992 document, "Five Hundred Years of Injustice: The Legacy of Fifteenth Century Religious Prejudice," explained the meaning of the Doctrine of Discovery. Newcomb, an American Indian of Shawnee and Lenape ancestry, and researcher of United States federal Indian law and international law, beginning with early Christendom, wrote these



A conversation on the doctrine of discovery will always entail a discussion of Native American or Indigenous lands. Moreover, because the doctrine has been a central part of U.S. law regarding tribal lands, the Presbyterian Church has played a major role historically in the implementation of the doctrine. As the National Capital overture stated, "[d]uring all ... periods of American history, Christian churches ... have accepted and supported the various forms of the Doctrine of Discovery We have participated both actively

and passively throughout our history in discriminatory behavior directed against Native Americans. We have stood by while Native Americans were killed and their lands taken, while the story of their participation in the history of our country was distorted and suppressed."

words: "When Christopher Columbus first set foot on the white sands of Guanahani Island, he performed a ceremony to 'take possession' of the land for the king and queen of Spain, acting under the international laws of Western Christendom...his act of 'possession' was based on a religious document now known in history as the Doctrine of Discovery." The following statements include two paragraphs, at the beginning of the document, that explain the rationale for the report prepared by the PC(USA).

The Doctrine of Discovery: A Review of Its Origins and Implications for Congregations in the PC(USA) and Support for Native American Sovereignty — Report to the 223rd General Assembly (2018)

At the 222nd General Assembly in 2016, the Presbyterian Church (USA) adopted recommendations for action on the Doctrine of Discovery. Recommendation 7 of item 11-24 calls upon the PC(USA) to "confess its complicity and repudiate the Doctrine of Discovery, and direct the Presbyterian Mission Agency and the Office of the General Assembly, in consultation with ACREC [Advisory Committee on Racial Ethnic Concerns], to initiate a process of review of the Doctrine of Discovery." This process includes the preparation of a report that: (1) describes the Doctrine of Discovery and explains its history; (2) makes recommendations of how congregations in the PC(USA) can support Native Americans in their ongoing efforts for sovereignty and fundamental human rights; (3) describes how relationships with specific Native American individuals and tribes can be developed; and (4) suggests specific ways in which congregations may recognize, support, and cooperate with Native American individuals, tribes, and nations who reside within their communities. With this action the PC(USA) joins other denominations who have taken actions to repudiate the doctrine of discovery.

Did you know we are identified by PCUSA as both an Earth Care Congregation AND a PCUSA Hunger Congregation? Want to know more? Items your advocacy team will be addressing in this new year:

RECYCLING: Did you know we have recycling bins in the hallway between the kitchen and Heartland Hall? Sign up to be a recycling hero — cardboard, plastics and metal are collected and can be taken for proper recycling. Paper in the big paper bins in the west end of the GCPC parking lot, plastics and metal to your home collection or to the 119th recycling center. Please sign up for your turn to care for our planet.

CERTIFICATION RENEWAL: Our renewal audit for our PCUSA recertification as an Earth Care Congregation will be conducted in January. Session Meeting

Session met on December 17, 2018 in room 5, with Reverend Mitch Trigger serving as moderator. In addition to the elders, Reverend Sue Trigger and Deacon Eileen Thomson were present.

Team minutes: Aaron Soule shared that the Finance team is meeting later this week. He predicted it would be an unpleasant meeting as offerings are running significantly behind this year. Tim Hayden pointed out that statements have not been mailed so that members might not be aware of how far they are behind. Aaron said that had been taken care of. On a related note, the Personnel team brought a motion that Session approve the hiring of a part-time financial administrator to work 20 hours per week. The motion passed unanimously.

Consent agenda: The minutes of the November Session meeting and the transfer of Tatum Specht's membership to St. Andrew Presbyterian Church in Denton, TX, were approved, as was the request to move Jim & Susan Bloom to inactive (bringing our total membership to 501). Session approved January 27, 2019 as the date of the annual meeting, as well as having one service on February 24, 2019, at 10:00 a.m. for Youth Sunday.

Deacons' report: David Eileen Thomson reported that the covenant groups are going to be adjusted with some members remaining in their groups and others moving.

Old business: Session heard a report from the Nominating Team. Reinstating the Elder on Duty function was discussed. There needs to be more communication to members that the church doors will be open at 8:00 a.m. and elders will take turns unlocking the doors and turning on the lights. The Executive Committee members will work on changing the bylaws to reflect co-pastors instead of just pastor/associate pastor positions. The changes will need to be voted on at the congregational meeting in January.

New business: Session voted to retain that Aaron Soule as President, Julie Passett as Vice-President, Matt McBride as Treasurer and Cheryl Johnson as Secretary.

After sharing some joys and concerns of the congregation, Mitch closed the meeting in prayer and the meeting adjourned at 8:13 p.m.
