Message from Rev. Karen

As we begin this journey together, let me start by saying thank you for allowing me to walk this road alongside you. The interim process is not short – as you may remember. In the weeks to come we will be asking questions about what is working and what is not. We will also take a look at who Grace Covenant is today, not who you were 10 years or 25 years ago. There is some information that can be used from visioning work over the past few years, however since the last mission study we had a global pandemic and the entire landscape of what it means to be church has shifted. We will work through this process in as timely a way as we can.

I hope to get into a rhythm of joining committees every other month, but moderators, if you need me to be there let me know. God is already at work and there is a bright future ahead. Clerk's Corner

I want to start with an apology and also a huge THANK YOU to Kathy Williams. We neglected to recognize her as a team moderator at the annual meeting. Kathy has been SO instrumental in bringing new members into our Congregation, and we appreciate her!

In other Session news, at the February meeting we had the opportunity to "examine" some of our newly ordained/installed Deacons and I think most of us learned something new about each of them.

Our Facility continues to be a hot topic. The fire detection system repairs continue and facilities team is considering options for replacing HVAC components that were damaged. We are working on updating our contract with Pioneer Preschool. Facilities team is looking at what space is and isn't being used as our Finance Administrator needs more file storage and we've had requests from our partners EncoreKC! and the Arabic Christian Fellowship to have some space to use.

The "F" teams are busy these days as Finance Team brought several updates to Session. Session passed a motion allowing interest that is earned on the money in our Endowment Fund in 2024 to be rolled over into our operating funds instead of being reinvested. This motion stands for one year only and is in accordance with the parameters established for our Endowment. Finance is looking to move funds into accounts that are more easily accessible than the current PILP funds and Session concurred with that decision. Finally, we have several reserve funds that were established in memory of different church members with no specific use recorded. Individual Session members have agreed to reach out to the families of those members to find out if the families have any preferences on how that money should be used.

Grace Covenant will turn 40 in the summer of 2025! Kristy Shaw is starting to work on planning our celebration. If you have thoughts or ideas or would just like to be part of a fun, celebratory group, reach out to Kristy to get involved!

Any Session member will be happy to answer any questions you have, but remember that our teams do most of the real work of the church!

Give Up Plastic Bags During Lent! (and win a prize!)

TAKE THE CHALLENGE! Many plastic bags are used for a matter of minutes and then sit in a landfill for hundreds of years. They contribute to climate change and plastic pollution, and can harm wildlife. So join the challenge and stop using plastic bags!

Here's how to participate:

- 1. <u>Between February 14 and March 28</u>, take a selfie every time you use a reusable bag (or just a photo of your reusable bag, if you don't want to be in the picture).
- 2. Upload it to https://https://gcpc.org/reusablebag.
- 3. Whoever has the most photos uploaded by midnight on March 28 will win a prize! The winner will be announced in worship on April 7.

The Rules:

- You can take one photo per place where you normally would receive a single use bag. So if you buy groceries and use 6 reusable bags to take them all home, you can take one photo of all 6 bags to upload.
- Photos from one household should all be submitted by the same person (to make it easier to count submissions and determine the winner).
- You can only submit photos from people who live with you. So unless your children/grandchildren/other relatives live with you, you can't submit their photos under your name.
- You don't have to upload photos on the day they are taken you could upload all your photos at 11:59pm on March 28 if you'd like.

GFN has made significant progress in working with Johnson County government on issues of:

- Mental Health, with a new twelve-bed facility for those with mental health crisis events opening in Olathe this summer.
- Homelessness, with progress toward opening the former LaQuinta Inn as a homeless shelter.
- Affordable Housing, with clear progress toward establishing an affordable housing trust fund.

We want to bring several future events to your attention:

On Sunday April 14, GFN will hold the Solutions Briefing - an update for GFN members on progress made and the next steps on-going research on the three issues has suggested.

On Tuesday May 7, at 6 pm at Resurrection Methodist Church, the Nehemiah Action meeting will take place, where the entire Johnson County network, hopefully several thousand people, talks to county leaders and conveys desired future actions on the three issues.

On Sunday March 24, we are asking GFN members (and any others who are interested) to join us during the Sunday school time after worship to look forward to April 14, and May 7. We would like to encourage a large GCPC attendance at the May 7, Nehemiah Action. Let Dave, Mikki, Tim, Don or Joy know if you have questions.

Shrove Tuesday Pancake Supper Thank you!




Communion Workshop Thank you!

Our March Donation Partner is UPLIFT

Three evenings a week four UPLIFT trucks disperse into the Kansas City Metropolitan area in order to distribute warm meals and basic survival needs to the homeless in the Kansas City area. UPLIFT is a fully volunteer organization. Grace Covenant participates in UPLIFT every fourth Saturday. In January GCPC members provided hot meals for 60-90 people and donated an amazing 535 pairs of gloves. Your generosity and kindness is overwhelming!

In the Spring, HIGH NEED items include new underwear for men and women so that is our designated March donation request. The links below (scan the QR codes with your smart phone camera and select the link) show Amazon items suggested by the UPLIFT organization. Of course, if you have another place you prefer shopping, please go right ahead. These links will give you a good feel for what is needed. We can't have Amazon orders delivered to the church. They need to be delivered either to my home address (Kevin Johnson, 12840 Century Street, Overland Park, KS 66213) or to your home. If they are delivered to your home please place them in the weekday entrance labeled "UPLIFT".

Once a month, an email goes out to GCPC members who are on our UPLIFT distribution list identifying recipe items needed for the hot meal and the current HIGH NEED items. If you would like to be included in
