Living the Gospel: How Your Giving Changes Lives

One of the most powerful aspects of ministry at Grace Covenant Presbyterian Church is the spirit of generosity that has been part of this congregation's identity for the past 40 years. Because of your faithful giving—both past and present—I am entrusted with a Pastor's Discretionary Fund, which allows me to respond to needs that arise in the lives of those who walk through our doors in need of help.

Recently, a woman came into the church with her two daughters, ages four and eight. They played with Legos and Play-Doh while she shared her story—through Google Translate on her phone. Her



husband had been arrested and deported by ICE. She feared separation from her children and asked for help purchasing one-way plane tickets to return to her home country with her girls.

It was one of the most painful and holy conversations I've ever had. I was heartbroken by her request, overwhelmed by the complexity of her situation—and at the same time, I was grateful. Grateful that because of your generosity, I could say yes. I could help her act with dignity and care for her children.

This is who you are, GCPC. A congregation that shows up. A people who give—not just to keep the lights on or programs running—but to be a living witness to the compassion of Christ. I continue to be amazed by your faith, your trust, and your deep commitment to living out the gospel in real and tangible ways.

As we look to the future, I am excited about the ministry we will continue to do together. I believe God is still calling us to be bold in love and generous in spirit.

Thank you for being such an extraordinary part of the body of Christ.

Stephen Ministry

At one point in the history of GCPC, there were trained Stephen Ministers. Stephen Ministry is a one-to-one, confidential, Christ-centered care ministry that equips lay people to offer emotional and spiritual support to others who are facing challenges such as grief, loneliness, divorce, hospitalization,



or other life transitions. Founded on the principles of compassionate presence and faithful listening, Stephen Ministers are not counselors or problem solvers. They are trained caregivers who reflect God's love through their presence.

We have been approached about restarting this care and outreach ministry at GCPC.

Please contact Pastor Karen if you would be open to exploring a call to serve as a Stephen Minister and would be available to participate in training through Village Presbyterian Church beginning in January of 2026. Stephen Ministers provide a listening ear and a caring heart to those in need.




Thursday Morning Bible Study Group

We heard a report from EncoreKC! and renewed our contract with them as our Artist in Residence for three more years.

We heard reports from most of our busy teams. Liz Chandler has resigned as moderator of the Facilities Team, and we thank her for her many years of hard work, keeping our facility functioning and organized! The Facilities Team is busy talking to roofing contractors regarding the roof on the west wing. We approved the purchase of a video camera which can be used around the church and will also serve as a ready-to-use backup if our livestream ever goes down at a critical time. We discussed hiring an AVL consultant to provide a design to upgrade our audio/visual/lighting system but are not moving forward with that at this time.

The Finance Team has started meeting with other teams regarding their 2026 budgets and plans to have a proposed budget prepared by September.

A meeting of the congregation has been called after worship on Sunday, August 17. for the purpose of electing at-large members of the nominating committee. It will be a short one! We are also excited that we will be welcoming new members into our congregation that morning.

Your entry form and check need to be received no later than Sunday, September 14th in order to reserve your spot.



Awakening to Worship, Our Children's Service

Our Children's Service at Grace Covenant is called Awakening to Worship, and it is offered to children ages four years old through 1st grade. It is based on the books *Young Children and Worship* by Sonja M. Stewart and Jerome W. Berryman and *Following Jesus* by Sonja M. Stewart. The authors believe that, "It involves helping children worship in a special place apart from the worshiping congregation so they become able to worship meaningfully with the congregation".

The service is facilitated by a "storyteller" and "greeters" each week in an inviting and quiet space.

The children learn to:

- 1. Assemble in God's Name (The Call to Worship, The Greeting, Songs of Praise with sign language)
- 2. Proclaim God's Word (Bible Story, Learn to Pray)
- Give Thanks to God (Preparing the Lord's Table, Prayer of Thanksgiving, The Lord's Prayer, Feast-Communion)
- 4. Go in God's Name (Hymn, Charge, Blessing)

The Bible stories, like "Noah", are told using wooden pieces. The Parables, like "The Mustard Seed," are told using flat pieces. The children also learn stories about "How the Church Tells Time" and "Baptism."

Awakening to Worship is open to children of church members and visitors. We are also looking for new volunteers to worship with our little ones. It is a chance to spend meaningful time with the children of our church. It's an unforgettable experience for all involved.
