Please choose one of the following service projects and sign up for it online at <u>www.gcpc.org/workship</u>. Each member of a household needs to sign up for a project and indicate whether they'll be eating lunch!

- The Whole Person Fall Lean Clean Up The Whole Person provides services to people with disabilities to ensure they are able live to independently in their communities. We'll be traveling to the homes of some of their clients who need help with fall landscape maintenance. Bring your workgloves, and wear clothes you don't mind getting dirty.
- **Beautify and Improve GCPC** With the help of Facilities team, we'll do many tasks to tidy up and make improvements in and around our own building: washing windows, cleaning under pews, sweeping, dusting, clearing fallen sticks and other chores. Bring a pair of workgloves if you want to work outside!

- Mission Quilts/Tactile Quilts- Help tie and bind a quilt for homeless relief, or make tactile quilts for nursing home residents with dementia. No sewing experience or supplies are necessary; we'll teach you what to do for either project. (If you have a sewing machine and want to bring it to make tactile quilts, that's great! But you don't have to bring a sewing machine to do either project.)
- Tour the Project Living Proof House at Metropolitan Energy Center - Join this project to tour a historic demonstration home in KCMO and learn how sustainability and efficiency are possible and affordable, even in older homes. - Starfish Project Plastic Bag Mats Sarah Stolberg from Project Starfish will teach us how to make mats from plastic grocery bags. Project Starfish distributes these mats to unhoused individuals to ensure they won't have to sleep on the bare ground. No experience is necessary!
- Stream Clean-up We'll do a stream clean-up for the city of Olathe. This project requires some scrambling up and down steep creek banks and lifting, as well as shoes and clothes that you don't mind getting wet and muddy. Volunteers should be at least 8 years old, and volunteers under 18 will need to complete a waiver. - Lunch + Clean Up Hungry people are going to come back from these projects and need lunch! Join this project to help prepare and serve lunch, set up Heartland Hall, and clean up afterwards. Everybody on this team gets lunch for free!
