A GREAT BIG THANK YOU, THANK YOU, THANK YOU! As we closed the 16-year project of collecting shoes, we challenged you to donate MORE in this one month than we had ever collected before. **AND YOU DID IT!** For April 2026 alone, GCPC and Belléz Design Studio (long-time partner in this endeavor) collected 1,050 pairs of shoes! Over the 16 years, we have delivered to S4S over 18,000 pairs of shoes! Your generosity has helped others in our KC metropolitan community. Putting shoes on babies from the Argentine Baby Closet; garden wellies & street shoes for the volunteers, workers, and homeless at Cherith Brook Catholic Worker house; shoed single mothers who now have the opportunity to have a pair of shoes she couldn't or wouldn't buy for herself; *and* sent shoes the national organization Soles4Souls who shares to keep shoes in circulation, putting shoes on bare feet, supporting local entrepreneurs by helping create jobs, and sustaining small businesses, keeping shoes out of the landfill for a cleaner planet for all God's creation.

MAY COMMUNION OFFERING RECIPIENT — CROP HUNGER WALK: CROP Hunger Walks are community-based fundraising events held in cities and towns across the United States. They support the global mission of Church World Service, a faith-based organization transforming communities around the globe through just and sustainable responses to hunger, poverty, displacement and disaster.

The Crop Project began in 1947 when farmers were asked to donate food and seed crops to our hungry neighbors in post-World War II Europe and Asia. The first CROP Hunger Walks took place in Bismarck, ND (1969), and York, PA (1970). Since then, CROP Hunger Walk events have been held in hundreds of communities, large and small, raising millions of dollars to eradicate hunger and poverty.

Hunger is one of the greatest injustices facing our world, but it doesn't have to be this way. Ending hunger is possible in our lifetime. The Heart of America CROP Walk won't take place until this fall, but we can support the global CROP organization now.
