Here is our Generosity fulfillment for Grace Covenant's pledges through July 2025. The Generosity Team is delighted to share our 2025 fulfillment numbers as of August 5. We have received 61% of our total pledges and 58% of this 2025 year has gone by us. Often our summer giving drops due to travel, vacation and absences; so, it very refreshing to see everyone's summer commitment so strong. There is a slight revision in our pledge total due to some members having to decrease their pledge amount. We certainly understand and recognize the value of their update. **We continue to appreciate everyone who has contributed to Grace Covenant.** Here is our progress shown by numbers of pledges:
