JULY DONATION PARTNER — SAFEHOME is a domestic violence shelter in Overland Park. Their core purpose is to provide a healing atmosphere where survivors of domestic violence can gain inner strength, explore options, and be empowered to live a life free of abuse. As the only domestic violence shelter in Johnson County, and the largest in the state of Kansas, Safehome strives to break the cycle of domestic violence and partner abuse for victims and their children in our community. Besides providing safe housing, Safehome also provides mental health counseling and legal services for shelter residents. Operating the shelter requires all the necessities of daily life for the women and children housed in it, many of whom leave their abusers with nothing but the clothes on their backs. You can help Safehome execute their important mission by donating an item from the list below; just leave donations in the Weekday Entrance bin anytime during July. Please note all items must be new, and toiletries must be full-sized.

JULY COMMUNION OFFERING RECIPIENT — PLEASE NOTE CHANGES FROM 2025 MISSION

CALENDAR: The July Communion Offering will be directed to the PCUSA Global Ecumenical Partnership Fund. Our original Mission Calendar indicated that the July Offering would be directed to Mission Coworkers. In January 2025, PCUSA leadership announced planned reductions in the number of mission co-workers by at least 50 percent due to financial constraints. This reduction was part of a restructuring that resulted in the Presbyterian Mission Agency and Office of the General Assembly being combined into the new Interim Unified Agency. The remaining Mission Co-workers have been re-designated as Global Ecumenical Liaisons. You can read more about the changes and what the Liaisons do here.

The 2025 Mission Calendar indicates that Communion Offering for July and August will be directed to the Presbyterian Mission Agency and the Mission Co-workers, respectively. We will direct the July Communion Offering to the Global Ecumenical Partnership fund under the new Interim Unified Agency — this is as close as we can get to funding what was the Presbyterian Mission Agency — and we'll redirect the August offering to Habitat for Humanity. If you have individual gifts directed to the account that was used to fund the mission coworkers (account E132192), those gifts will now be used to support the Global Ecumenical Liaisons.
