Clerk's Corner

At the December Session meeting, the primary topic of discussion was the 2025 Budget. With some trims in team requests, plans to strategically use designated and memorial funds, and recent additional pledges, we are within 3% of having a balanced budget for 2025. At this time, the Session has not approved a 2025 Budget - we are looking to teams to find a few more ways to trim their asks for the coming year in hopes of passing a balanced budget in the coming weeks. Our budget discussion covered many topics related to church funds. We discussed alternative ways of generating income and are still brainstorming in that department, so if you have ideas, please share them with Karen or a Session member. Since roughly one-half of our budget goes to staff salaries, we also discussed different ways that we might staff the church and are sending a variety of thoughts back to the personnel team. With Rebecca's departure, there will be changes in music staffing and it's easier to restructure when we're not displacing a beloved staff member. Music is one of the things that sets Grace Covenant apart and we are committed to maintaining that in a way that makes sense for the church that we are now and will be in the next five years or so.

As part of his work on the personnel team, Chris Krug has undertaken an overhaul of the church Operating Manual, which the Session adopted with tremendous appreciation for Chris's efforts! We also approved Communion dates for 2025 and called the annual Congregational and Corporation meeting for Sunday January 26, 2025, following worship.

In addition to reports from many of our Teams, we received a report from the Transition discussions that were held on Sunday mornings in November and will be taking those into consideration as we move forward.

Due to Martin Luther King Jr. Day, the January Session meeting will be held on January 13, 2025. The Session's current contract with Karen runs through February 2025 and we will be discussing options for renewal at that meeting as well as some changes to the church bylaws to bring them in line with current practice.

We are excited about all the activities going on at Grace Covenant and hope you are, too. As always, if you have questions or concerns, please share them with a Session member.

JOCO IHN Update

Grace Covenant has been a host church with Johnson County IHN for the past 20 years.

Many of our members have participated in various ways, such as preparing food, driving guests to and from the Family Center, hosting



evening or overnight shifts, setting up, taking down, coordinating breakfast/snacks, and volunteering for laundry. We have been blessed to partner with two support churches: Indian Heights United Methodist Church and Shawnee Mission United Universalist Church.

The original model for our program relied on a 13-week rotation with 13 different host faith communities. However, by late 2024, the number of host congregations had declined to three: St. Andrew Episcopal, Asbury Methodist, and Grace Covenant. The other 10 weeks were covered by our guests staying in motel rooms. With the anticipation of a Johnson County Homeless Shelter proposed for the former Denny's and LaQuinta Inn, expected to start operations in late 2024 or early 2025, the JOCO IHN Family Center closed in July rather than negotiate a new contract or relocate.

Our November 2024 rotation was canceled due to guest noncompliance. At that time, only Asbury and Grace Covenant remained as host churches. In discussions with Asbury, it became clear that the original model was no longer viable, and there were significant differences between faith-based housing and motel housing. These included the strict rules and curfews instituted at host churches to ensure consistent expectations for our guests, the lack of in-person staff interaction due to the closed Family Center, and the subsequent comfort level of host churches with the reduced face-to-face staff interaction. Of most concern was the host church model treating guests more like children (with curfews and rules) versus the motel model that gave guests their own schedule and more independence.

In a teleconference with Vicki Dercher, Executive Director, Elizabeth Barker, Board Chair, and remaining primary coordinators, we shared these concerns and conveyed our decision to end our participation as host congregations.

We also acknowledged that our 20-year success in addressing situational homelessness in Johnson County resulted in:

- Total individuals served: 927
- Children: 531 (inclusive of the number above)
- Single Females: 102
- Bednights: 60,174
- Meals: 180,522

Christine Caseres and I (Jane Knoche) are very thankful for the dedication of all our IHN volunteers and know that this decision will take some adjustment. We have experienced tears and grief in letting this program shift to the new model. We want to recognize our IHN journey with a celebration and thank you to all our volunteers in early 2025.
