# GRACE NOTES

## **Looking at a Middle Path**

The Season of Lent is underway, traditionally one of the most important of the church seasons. In the early days of the church, there were NO seasons or holidays observed, only the Sabbath or Lord's Day. While those early Christians kept the memory of Christ's crucifixion and resurrection, Easter (the 1st of the Christian holidays) wasn't celebrated until the 2nd century and Lent began being observed shortly after the Council of Nicea in 325 AD.

That's why, in some traditions, Lent isn't observed at all. But Lent, Easter, Pentecost, Advent, Christmas, and Epiphany are important tools in our faith development. Why do we observe birthdays and anniversaries in our families? Because they are important markers in time, helping us in holding on to our memories of our lives together. The same can be said of our seasons in the church year. During each season or holiday, we focus on particular aspects of Jesus' ministry, death, and resurrection. They strengthen our understanding of who Jesus was and is, and what it means to follow the Way of Jesus Christ.

Most notably in the Roman Catholic tradition, Lent has been a time when church members focused on "giving up something" for Lent like sweets and chocolate, but as soon as Lent is over, they often no longer abstain. In many mainline Christian churches today, our emphasis during Lent is to consider taking on a "new habit," like helping out at a food pantry once a month, doing it not only for Lent but for the months and years ahead.

At Grace Covenant, we'll be looking at a middle path – giving up something for Lent, but the kind of action or habit that would be good for all of us to consider eliminating from our lives. Join us in worship, live or online, or watch the service on YouTube at your convenience and discover changes that would benefit us as individuals, as a congregation, and society as a whole.



Wow! The February Session meeting was a full one – which is great because it means we are an active congregation and not just sliding along! Here are some items we discussed and acted upon:

- We heard a report from the **We're all in this Together** team regarding using reusable and compostable dish wear. We expect a motion from this team next month.
- We voted to join the Good Faith Network for one year. Key volunteers have been identified and funds will be used from KAIROS, Mission team, and individual donors. For more information, talk to Rick Randolph or Mikki Walker
- Explored a discrepancy in the year's budget total. The issue has been referred to the Generosity team and will be discussed again in March
- Generosity Team's **Faith and Hope** ask has generated 28 pledges totaling about \$18,700 so far.



# **Arrowhead Day School** *Personal Hygiene Items*

GCPC will collect toothpaste, toothbrushes, shampoo, deodorant, and period products for students at Arrowhead Day School as part of the school's Caring for Kids partnership. Arrowhead Day School is located at 66th and Santa Fe in Overland Park and is Shawnee Mission School District's response for children and youth who need a caring, compassionate educational setting. Students come from throughout the Shawnee Mission School District and range in age from elementary through high school. Personal hygiene items will help support student needs as school staff work to bring about appropriate social and behavioral practices. *Drop off your donations of these items in the Weekday Entrance bins during the month of March*.

## March Communion Offering InterFaith Hospitality Network (IHN)

For many years, GCPC has hosted guests from the Interfaith Hospitality Network, a homelessness intervention program that helps restore stability to situationally homeless families in Johnson County. IHN has fed, housed, educated and empowered hundreds of wonderful people, thanks to their network of congregations and individual supporters. Last year, more than 75% of IHN guests obtained permanent housing after 90 to 180 days with us. The March Communion Offering will help support IHN's mission.

## **Communion Offering and Donation Partners:**

## **What They Are and How It Works**

Each month, GCPC collects both monetary and in-kind donations for designated organizations. This is nothing new - we've done it for many years. We know that GCPC is collectively aware of the donation partners - the weekday entrance bin for in-kind donations is consistently full by the end of the month. (Thanks as always for your support!) But we think awareness of the Communion Offering recipients is pretty low - these are the organizations that receive the monetary donations, which we call Communion Offering.

You can see a list of the planned Donation Partner and Communion Offering recipients for 2023 below. Some months the same organization gets both types of donations, and some months different organizations receive the offering and the in-kind donations. We try to have information in the bulletin each Sunday on who the partners for the current month are.

The way that Communion Offering works is simple. If you feel called to make a donation to the partner for the month, just put a check in the plate any Sunday or make an online donation anytime and mark it "Communion." It's that easy! There aren't any goals to meet or obligation to give; communion offering is entirely based on what each of us feels called to give. ## Pre-school 2-4 years:

The Grace Makers workshops will be learning about forgiveness through the season of Lent. Through music, art, games, cooking and more, the children

## **Children's Ministry Opportunities**

Awakening to Worship is our wonder and worship program for children ages 4-1st grade and meets following the children's sermon weekly. We invite children in elementary school to continue participating and experiencing worship as they move into the sanctuary for worship with the wider family of Grace Covenant.

**SMASH:** Once a month, SMASH happens! We ordinarily meet the third Sunday of the month from 4 – 6 p.m. in Heartland Hall. This popular program is an activity for kindergarten through 5/6th graders combining sports, music, arts, service, and "hangout" time and offers a time for children to be nurtured in faith by building relationships with a variety of adults of all ages.

This Lenten study will focus on practices that Jesus engaged in. Participants will dive deeply into actions lived and modeled by Jesus and across Scripture:





In this thoughtful study, respected Old Testament scholar Patricia K. Tull explores the Scriptures for guidance on today's ecological crisis. Tull looks to the Bible for what it can tell us about our relationships, not just to the earth itself, but also to plant and animal life, to each other, to descendants who will inherit the planet from



us, and to our Creator. She offers candid discussions on many current ecological problems that humans contribute to, such as the overuse of energy resources like gas and electricity, consumerism, food production systems—including land use and factory farming—and toxic waste.
