WHAT IS PER CAPITA? **Per Capita** is an amount paid per adult member of every PC(USA) congregation across the United States. It is a way we are the church together, and the local congregations support the work of the Presbytery, the Synod, and the General Assembly. While we have a line item in the budget for this expense, it helps our operating budget when members pay their per capita. **For 2026, the total cost per adult member is \$45.91.** That is split between the three higher governing bodies as follows. Heartland Presbytery 31.50; Synod of Mid-America 3.15; General Assembly 11.26 **NOTE:** There is a drop-down selection for per capita on our website if you choose to pay online. Navigate to the "Pay online" link or view the "Online Giving" tab. If you would like to write a check, please write Per Capita in the memo line.
