Journey of Resistence: Overcoming Temptation in Luke

Lent is a season of reflection, repentance, and renewal. It is a time to journey with Christ toward the cross, examining our hearts and drawing closer to God. This year our Lenten theme, "Journey of Resistance: Overcoming Temptation in Luke," invites us to consider the struggles we all face—temptations that seek to pull us away from God's purpose for our lives.

In the Gospel of Luke, we see Jesus confronted with temptation in the wilderness. Rather than giving in, He resists, turning instead to the truth of God's word. His example challenges us to consider: What temptations do we face in our daily lives? How do we continually turn away from what pulls us from God and return to Him?

Lent calls us to a posture of repentance not just turning away from sin, but turning toward a life more fully aligned with Christ. As we resist the temptations of anger, greed, fear, power, or complacency, we also embrace something deeper: the grace, love, and transformation God offers. What might

we need to surrender to follow Christ more faithfully?

2025 Operating Budget

Dear Grace Covenant Family,

The Finance Team and Session have approved the 2025 Operating budget. Our projected revenue for 2025 is \$797,500, with projected expenses of \$825,000. While this reflects a difference of just under \$30,000, it represents less than 4% of the overall budget.

Based on our history of faithful giving—where actual contributions often exceed projections—as well as our historically careful spending, the Finance Team and Session are confident in moving forward with this budget. Additionally, we continue to seek ways to make use of restricted funds designated for specific ministry areas. Restricted funds are available outside the Operating Budget.

We will monitor our financial situation closely and keep the congregation updated throughout the year. We will also be discussing **per capita giving**. For Heartland Presbytery, per capita is \$44.98 for every youth and adult member. The church remits payment to Presbytery based on our current membership numbers. For every individual who pays their \$44.98, less is paid from our operational budget. Per Capita funds Presbytery, Synod and General Assembly and supports ongoing work at those denominational levels. If every member pays their per capita, we reduce the spending by \$16,000.

Thank you for your ongoing generosity and commitment to Grace Covenant's ministry. Your faithful stewardship enables us to worship, serve, and grow together as we live out God's calling. If you have any questions about the budget, please feel free to reach out to a member of the Finance Team or Session.

Clerk's Corner

Session held our stated meeting on February 17 on Zoom due to the bitter cold weather. We provided feedback on the survey that will soon be sent to the congregation by the Transition Team. We approved the 2025 budget, which you can read about elsewhere in this newsletter. Musicians have been surveyed recently and the gap between our children's music programs and our adult music programs was identified as an area for growth. Interviews with prospective Interim Music Directors are ongoing.

We heard reports from the committees, which show the wide variety of life in our congregation. Increasingly, members of our congregation are reaching out with transportation and care needs. Next month we will be considering proposed changes to the Operations Manual made by the teams. We are also aware of several long time team moderators who have announced that they will be moving on to other activities in the near future. We authorized the use of \$3,000 from General Memorial Funds for the 40th Anniversary Celebration.
