THANKSGIVING EVE AT GCPC: FELLOWSHIP, FOOD & WORSHIP! WEDNESDAY, NOVEMBER 23 Thanksgiving begins a month of real appreciation and fellowship for all of us at Grace Covenant. As has been the tradition at GCPC, we will begin by having a Chili Supper on Thanksgiving Eve, November 23, at 5:30pm. We need chili, toppings, cornbread, cookies, etc. Volunteers are also needed for set-up and clean-up. Following the chili supper in Heartland Hall, we'll move to the Sanctuary at 6:45pm for Gathering Music by our Dixieland Band and then share a worship service at 7pm, focused on our thanks and gratitude to God and one another.

NOISY OFFERING FOR ARTS IN PRISON: Got lots of change weighing down your pockets? Bring it to worship **November 20**, and toss it in the Noisy Offering! A Noisy Offering is when the children of the congregation walk among the pews with coffee cans to collect spare change. We then donate the collected coins to a charitable organization. The November 20 offering will go to Arts in Prison. Arts in Prison uses the arts to inspire positive change in the incarcerated, to reduce recidivism, and to reconnect offenders with their communities. They bring classes in performing arts, visual arts, communication, yoga, choral singing and writing to prison inmates; recidivism rates among Arts in Prison participants are much lower than among the general prison population. GCPC has hosted concerts for the East Hill Singers — formed of Arts in Prison participants at Lansing Correctional Facility — several times in the past. Please bring your spare change and be a part of this GCPC tradition!

We have an extra service opportunity with them on the afternoon of November 21. Renewed Hope's mobile kitchen will be traveling to Hope Family Care Center (3027 Prospect Ave., KCMO).
