Bible Story

Peter and John at the Temple (Acts 3:1-10)

After Jesus was arrested and died, God raised him from the dead three days later. Before Jesus returned to heaven, he promised his followers that the Holy Spirit would be with them and give them strength to continue his work.

One day, Peter and John were going to the temple to pray when they saw a man who could not walk. Every day, people carried him to the temple gate so he could ask others for money. Because of the rules at that time, he was not allowed inside the temple. The man asked Peter and John for money. Peter looked at him and said, "I don't have any money, but I will give you what I do have. In Jesus' name, get up and walk!" Peter helped him stand, and right away the man could walk, jump, and praise God. Then he went into the temple for the first time. This story reminds us that Jesus brings hope and healing, and with God's help, amazing things can happen.

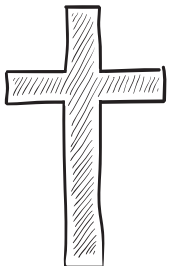


Daily Prayer
