AS WE COME TO THE END OF THE FIRST QUARTER, the Generosity Team would like to celebrate the generosity and commitment of the members of Grace Covenant! For 2024, we have seen an increase in submitted pledges from 103-114 and fewer rollover pledges (16 down from 27).
