At the Threshold: *Conversations on the Way to the Cross*

Lent is a season of repentance—it is also a season of listening.

A season of standing at the edge of something not yet fully known.

We will listen to Jesus through conversations. Conversations that happen at thresholds—between night and day, belief and doubt, grief and hope, fear and trust. These are not quick exchanges. They unfold slowly. They ask honest questions. They leave people changed.

In the wilderness (*Matthew 4:1–11*), Jesus stands at the threshold between identity and temptation. In the quiet of night (*John 3:1–17*), Nicodemus comes with questions he can barely put into words. At a well at noon (*John 4:5–42*), a Samaritan woman finds herself seen and known. Outside the temple (*John 9:1–41*), a man born blind moves from darkness into sight—while others struggle to see. At a tomb (*John 11:1–45*), grief opens the way for resurrection hope.


In each of these moments, Jesus does not rush people across the threshold. He meets them where they are—at a well, in the wilderness, in grief, in darkness—and invites them to remain long enough for truth to surface. These conversations are not about having the right answers. They are about becoming ready for transformation.

We are invited to pause, to listen, to notice where we are standing between what has been and what might be. At the threshold of repentance. Of healing. Of new life.

As we journey toward the cross, may we be attentive to the questions Jesus asks us.

May we be honest about our fears and our hopes. And may we discover that even at the threshold—especially at the threshold—God is already at work, drawing us toward resurrection.

Holy Week Worship

March 29, Palm / Passion Sunday: Worship at 9:30am. The Chancel Choir brings us Craig Courtney's adaptation of *Amazing Grace* framing the beginning of Holy Week, inviting us to hear the story of grace with both celebration and tenderness as we enter the final days of Lent. Allen York, soloist.

April 2, Maundy Thursday: Worship at 7:30pm. Sacrament of Communion. Praise Team. A reflective service remembering Christ's final meal with his disciples and the commandment to love one another as we gather at the table before the cross.

April 3, Good Friday/Tenebrae Service: Worship at 7:30pm. Chancel Choir featuring cellist Daniel Yung. Heather Sorenson's *Tenebrae* leads us through the ancient service of shadows. As candles are gradually extinguished, darkness fills the sanctuary, symbolizing the crucifixion and the silence of the tomb. Through choral music, scripture, prayer, and piano and cello reflection, we are invited not simply to observe the story, but to enter it.

April 5, Easter Sunday Worship / One Great Hour of Sharing: Worship services at 9am and 11am. Sermon by Rev. Karen Wright. Sacrament of Communion. (**NOTE: *The flowering of the cross begins 15 minutes prior to the start of each worship service.*)

Music at 9am by the Praise Team. A joyful service filled with energetic song and proclamation of the resurrection.

Music at 11am by the Chancel Choir, organ, brass, orchestra, and Charter Ringers, a full and triumphant musical celebration of Easter's hope.

Celtic Spirituality History and Practice

Lenten Adult Education Study led by Rev. Karen Wright

March 1 - March 29, 10:45am, Room 3

History is taken from *How the Irish Saved Civilization* by Thomas Cahill and *Mythical Ireland* by Anthony Murphy. Practices come from *The Soul's Slow Ripening* by Christine Valters Paintner.

March 1: History Overview. *Ancient Ireland, Pre-Christian, St. Patrick Monastic Communities.*

March 8: Spiritual Practice of Thresholds - *Thresholds are moments and places of change. We are invited to pause, notice and listen.*

March 15: Spiritual Practice of Learning by Heart - *Knowing something deep within us is a practice that gives us wisdom even in moments of struggle. It goes deeper than memorization and is engrained within us.*

March 22: Spiritual Practice of Solitude and Silence - *Creating space to encounter God beyond the constant noise of the world. Practice attentive presence allows us to learn to rest in God.*

March 29: Spiritual Practice of 3 Essential Things - *This is a practice to help discern what are the three most important things in this season of your life?*

March Music & Worship

Join us this March as our Lenten journey continues, moving from reassurance and prayer toward the dramatic entrance into Holy Week. Each Sunday's music helps us listen more deeply, sing faithfully, and prepare our hearts for the story of Christ's passion and resurrection.

Sunday, March 1 - Second Sunday of Lent

Worship will be led by the Praise Team. Familiar and welcoming music helps the congregation gather confidently and center our worship at the start of the month as we continue the Lenten journey of repentance and trust.

Sunday, March 8 - Third Sunday of Lent

Worship will be led by Linda Dover, organ, and the Chancel Choir. The choir will share *Even Here* by Mark Miller, a gentle reminder that God's presence accompanies us in every moment. Its message encourages trust and hope as we continue through Lent.

Sunday, March 15 - Fourth Sunday of Lent

Worship will be led by Linda Dover, organ, and the Chancel Choir. We will hear *Create in Me* by Terre Johnson, a reflective musical prayer asking for renewal and honest transformation. This music invites quiet listening and personal reflection in the middle of the season.

Sunday, March 22 - Fifth Sunday of Lent

Worship will be led by the Praise Team, with music by the Jubilation Ringers. Voices and bells join together in worship leadership, combining musical gifts in a joyful expression of the church's shared song as we approach Holy Week.
