Clerk's Corner

The Session met as scheduled on March 17 — with many of us decked out in green! We received initial feedback from the congregational survey and look forward to discussing the full results in a few weeks. We will have representatives from Heartland Presbytery's Commission on Ministry join us in April to discuss our transition process and how we want to move forward.

We received reports from many of our Teams. There are many ongoing maintenance needs (minor sheet rock repairs, painting, etc.) and the Facilities Team is looking for volunteers who are willing to help with these. We had a discussion of the value of streaming worship. In general, we feel like it is an important part of our ministry, but we need to decide whether we want to continue to do it with a patchwork of "personal" video equipment or if we want to invest in a commercial grade system. The Facilities Team will investigate some more exact prices and this conversation will continue. Funds from the Mary Johnson Memorial account will be used to replace some furniture in the nursery.

We granted KAIROS permission to sell reusable shopping bags on Earth Day and discussed a proposal for installing a water bottle filling station. We discussed the type and location and the feeling that this may be more of a "want" than a "need." KAIROS will gather more information.

We approved updates to several sections of the Operating Manual to bring the manual into better alignment with our actual current practice and updates to the Personnel Manual to clarify some details of benefits and part-time employment. We also approved some minor updates to the church bylaws. These will have to be approved by the congregation but are not time sensitive, so those will be presented to the congregation the next time we have a congregational meeting.

Kairos Committee Selling Grocery Bags

We are excited to introduce a new recyclable grocery bag for our GCPC members and friends. The bag has the GCPC, Earthcare and 40th Anniversary logos pictured on the front. We hope to encourage more use of recycled bags vs plastic for grocery store use. The bags will available for \$3 each, and you can pay by check or cash.

We will share more information about them on Palm Sunday and we will have a special children's time on May 4th to talk about how we can care for the Earth. **Bags can be purchased after the service on Palm Sunday or May 4th.** Any additional donations over the \$3 will be used to help fund PeaceWorks KC, whose mission is: To nonviolently embody and empower our community through organizing acts of civil resistance and works for peace. Peace is attained only through justice for all.

AN INTERFAITH JUSTICE ORGANIZATION

Supporting the Good Faith Network is Easy!

Grace Covenant is among twenty-seven congregations in Johnson County that support the Good Faith Network's (GFN) efforts seeking justice through interactions with Johnson County government.

In its initial years, the network worked on issues of mental health, ending homelessness, and affordable housing. The 2025 opening of a mental health crisis stabilization unit for voluntary patients, as early as June, is one outstanding result of GFN's efforts.

During the 2024–25 cycle, GFN has added elder care to the issues it is working on. Their research has uncovered a program called CAPABLE (Community Aging in Place Advancing Better Living for Elders) that has significant promise. (Check it out by Googling "CAPABLE program.")

How can you support GFN? Twenty-seven Grace Covenant members are "members" of GFN through their commitment to try and attend four GFN events. One of those events, the Nehemiah Action on Tuesday May 6 at 6pm at Resurrection Methodist Church in Leawood, is the event where GFN demands are made to Johnson County government. To show the power of the network, there is a goal of 1,600 people attending that event, with at least 75 from Grace Covenant.

Could you attend and perhaps bring friends? It would be helpful if you let Dave Pack, Eileen Thomson, or Joy or Don Wilson know that you plan to attend.

Another significant event for the GFN is the **Solutions Briefing on Sunday, April 6 at 3pm** at Grace UMC, 11485 South Ridgeview Road in Olathe. At this event, the asks to be presented to Johnson County government at the Nehemiah Action will be revealed.

It is easy to support the GFN by attending these events. Know that it is the standard GFN practice that events will last no longer than 90 minutes.
