GRACE NOTES

In January, the Session of Grace Covenant made the decision to return to online only worship services and Christian Education classes, due to another surge in COVID-19 (fueled by the omicron variant). At that time, we agreed to return to in-person worship on February 13, provided conditions had improved.

On January 29, the Session agreed to extend worship to online only through February 27. The reasons for this were numerous:

- The infection rate for Johnson County remains higher now than it was during the height of the pandemic last year. The Kansas City area is experiencing higher numbers than parts of the country that were peaking early last month.
- There have been increasing numbers of very young children in our community getting COVID. Children's Mercy Hospital reports a broader age range of children being infected, with higher numbers. Their ICU beds are full as of January 31.
- A higher number of our own church members have been reporting to us that they have tested positive for COVID.

The Session will re-visit this decision closer to the end of February. We are hoping by that time our community will begin to reflect the downturn in COVID cases evident in other parts of the country. We also want to emphasize that it is only our Worship service and Christian Education classes that we're requiring to be online. Outside organizations, teams, and small groups are allowed to make their own decisions regarding in-person meetings.

Thank you for your patience – the health and safety of our members is of utmost importance. Please be sure to join us online on Sunday mornings for worship and Christian Education, via Facebook and Zoom.

Clerk's Corner

The session of Grace Covenant Presbyterian Church held its stated meeting on **January 17, 2022** at 7:05pm, via Zoom. Reverend Sue Trigger served as moderator. In addition to the ruling elders, Deacon Meredith Watson was present as well as Nelson Townsend from the Core Values Task Force.

Consent Agenda: The minutes of the December meeting were approved as well as affirming the results of an electronic vote suspending in person worship and an electronic vote approving a request from Dennis and Laura Patton that they be removed from our membership rolls.

Finance Team: The team submitted a motion to update the signors on our bank accounts. An additional \$5000 in pledges was received. There have also been a few software snags where committed pledges were not reported. We also received an anonymous donation of \$30,000.

Clerk's Report: After reaching out to several people who have not been active in the congregation for the last few years, we have removed them from our rolls and have a current membership of 362 members.

Co-pastors' report: One spiritual will be sung each week of Lent 2022 and the story will be incorporated into the sermon. Session approved collection of a donation each week during Lent 2022 in recognition of African American contributions to our hymnody with the proceeds going to a local music program.

Deacon's report: Meredith Watson that 2022 Covenant Groups are not yet finalized. Deacon training will happen in February. Two new deacons have been identified and two offers are being considered.

Old Business: The Session continues to monitor COVID data and will make a decision about when to resume in-person worship on January 29. A new Core Values document was approved which will be shared with the Congregation at the Annual Meeting.

New Business: Arrangements for the Virtual Annual Meeting on January 30, 2022 were discussed.

After sharing joys and concerns the meeting adjourned at 8:20pm and Rev. Sue Trigger closed with a prayer.

February 6: Follow Me: Baptize:

Remember Your Baptism; A baptism is a moment of marking and a moment of welcoming. God marks an individual whom God has created with an invisible mark of love and acceptance. The church welcomes that person whom God loves as part of the church family and the body of Christ. When we respond to the call of Jesus and profess



our faith, we are immersed in the waters of baptism. And, whether that is done literally—by being submerged and brought up—or symbolically—by water being placed on the head in some fashion—the action of baptism is the same and is carried out in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. God claims us as God's own in the waters of baptism. The Baptize unit picks up where the baptismal event leaves off. Baptized persons live into their identity as children of God through daily acts of discipleship on a lifelong journey of growing in faith.

February 13 - February 20: Follow Me: Sabbath Practices:

Christians who wish to explore Sabbath keeping need to have a rich and realistic debate about what specific forms Sabbath practice might take today. Within the complexities of contemporary culture, no specific plan will be accessible to all, and it will be important not to turn the Sabbath into a day that reeks of condemnation rather than gift, as some have done in the past. But pondering, discerning, and having hard conversations about what our present way of living in time is doing to us and how we can respond—this is a good thing indeed. February 6 – February 20: The Reason for God: Belief in an Age of Skepticism

Timothy Keller, the founding pastor of Redeemer Presbyterian Church (PCA) in New York City, addresses the frequent doubts that skeptics, and even ardent believers, have about religion. Using literature, philosophy, real-life conversations, and potent reasoning, Keller explains how the belief in a Christian God is, in fact, a sound and rational one. To true believers he offers a solid platform on which to stand their ground against the backlash to religion created by the Age of Skepticism. And to skeptics, atheists, and agnostics, he provides a challenging argument for pursuing the reason for God. We recommend participants use a copy of the book as well as the discussion guide. The discussion guide is available from Pastor Sue today. The book is also available on Kindle from Amazon for those who prefer an electronic copy.


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February 27: Ash Wednesday and Lent

Harvesters most needed items include: canned vegetables (low sodium); canned fruits in 100% juice; dried fruit (no added sugar preferred); canned chicken, tuna, salmon (packed in water); brown rice, whole grain pasta; dried beans or canned low sodium beans; peanut, almond, or sun butter; canned soup (chicken, tomato or vegetable); cereal — hot and cold (whole grain, low sugar preferred); soap, deodorant; shampoo; and toilet paper.
