Living Easter Every Day: A Spring Reflection

Dear Grace Covenant Family,

May is a beautiful bridge between seasons and celebrations. The earth bursts into bloom, students graduate, and summer plans start to take shape. But most importantly, we are still in the season of Easter—a season, not a single Sunday, but seven weeks to practice living as resurrection people.

Transition News

We hope you'll make plans to attend a **Called Meeting of the Congregation on Sunday, May 11**, immediately following worship. This is an important time in the life of our church, and your presence and voice matter.

There will be three items of business for the congregation to vote on:

- 1. <u>Approval of the Slate of New Elders</u> We will vote to approve those who have been nominated and feel called to serve as elders in this next season of ministry.
- 2. <u>Approval of Updates to the Church By-laws</u> These changes have been carefully considered and recommended by Session. More information will be emailed to the congregation.
- 3. <u>Vote to Call Rev. Karen as Designated Pastor</u> Perhaps the most exciting item is the opportunity to formally call Pastor Karen to serve as Designated Pastor of Grace Covenant Presbyterian Church. The contract and more information will be emailed separately.

What is a Designated Pastor?

A Designated Pastor is an installed pastoral position with a set contract term. At our April Session meeting, the Session met with the Committee on Ministry (COM) and voted to enter a five-year contract with Pastor Karen. This would transition her from the current one-year transitional pastor contract to a longer-term commitment, providing stability and shared vision for the future.

The five-year contract is renewable, and it also leaves open the possibility of pursuing a more traditional called and installed pastoral relationship in the future, should both the congregation and Pastor Karen feel so led.

This step reflects prayerful discernment and careful listening to God's leading. We are grateful for the work of Ryan Hussey, Laura Johnson, Tom Stroud, and David Sutherland, who worked alongside Session to prepare the transitional report, and who guided us through adult education sessions, deacon covenant groups, and a congregational survey. Their leadership helped shape this moment of decision with grace and clarity.

Please plan to stay after worship on May 11 to be part of this meaningful and hopeful step forward.

Clerk's Corner

The Session had a very exciting meeting the day after Easter. Prior to the meeting we received the first draft of our study report (which will be shared with the Congregation in the coming weeks). The report points out the strengths and weaknesses of our congregation.

Dale Jackson, Presbyter for Vision and Leadership and Krista Kiger, our Liaison from Heartland Presbytery's Commission on Ministry (COM) joined us for the beginning of our meeting. Dale and Krista talked with us about options for moving forward in Pastoral Leadership now that the Transition Study is almost complete. The "traditional" next step would be to form a Pastor Nominating Committee to conduct a national search for our next "called and installed" pastor. Dale indicated that Grace Covenant would be a very attractive call for potential candidates. Another option is to enter a "Designated Pastor" contract with a pastor that we know for a defined term of 3-5 years. Either way, the candidate for the role would have to be approved by COM and Heartland Presbytery. Our Session decided that we would like to move forward with a five year* contract with Karen Wright as our Designated Pastor. (See details of the Designated Pastor role on page 2). One advantage of this defined time period is that in the final year of the contract, everyone involved can take time to discern how the pastoral relationship is working. Dale recommended using our Transition study as a roadmap for the next five years. This relationship will be voted on by the Congregation on May 11; it will also have to be approved by COM and the Presbytery (hopefully at the June 7 Presbytery meeting). Assuming all parties approve (which seems likely), we will have a Service of Installation for Karen!

In other business, we approved some updates to the History section of the Personnel Manual and approved a very part-time position for an Assistant to the Head of Staff. We approved Worship in the Park for Sunday, September 7, and moved September Communion to September 14, so it won't be in the park. We authorized the use of interest from some of the Endowment Funds by the Facilities team in 2025.

We are also excited that the Nominating Team has found a new class of Elders to serve on Session starting in June. These candidates (Chris Cabe, Debbie Campbell, Kevin Johnson, and Frank Slovick) will also be elected at the May 11 Congregational Meeting.

At the March meeting, the Session gave preliminary approval to some changes in our Bylaws. Those will also be on the agenda for the May 11 Congregational meeting.

The Deacons have identified several members who have not been responsive. Staff has reviewed the list and Session has reviewed the list. People on that list who have not been involved in the life of the church in the 1-2 years will be sent a letter asking if they would like to remain active members of Grace Covenant.

Next month we will be discussing the value of Livestreaming worship and options for doing so.

We are getting excited as our 40th Anniversary approaches in June and hope that you are, too. If you haven't RSVP'd yet, please do so at <u>gcpc.org/40th-rsvp</u>.

Generosity Fulfillment 2025 Update

Generosity through the Generations

The Generosity Team is excited to share our First Quarter 2025 fulfillment numbers. This quarter clearly shows that some of our members pay all or most of their pledge at the beginning, middle, or quarter of the calendar year. Our giving pattern this quarter tracks closely to last year's first quarter giving. The early payments of pledges have resulted in 31.3% of our pledged giving having been received. We are appreciative of everyone who has contributed to Grace Covenant.

Here is our progress shown by numbers of pledges:

26-50% fulfilled	18
51-75% fulfilled	4
76-100% fulfilled	12
\$723,971	\$226,719
