HAITIAN DISASTER RELIEF FOR 2021 EARTHQUAKE: On August 14, the people of Haiti were rocked by a 7.2 magnitude earthquake and accompanying aftershocks, taking nearly 2,000 lives, injuring over 3,000, and destroying homes and infrastructure for thousands more. Conditions in Haiti quickly worsened with the arrival of torrential rain from Tropical Storm Grace. For over a decade, GCPC has supported the Haitian people through Soles for Souls, Heart to Heart, Rocket Stoves, Children's Nutrition Project, Peanut Butter Project, alternative Christmas coupons, and an International Mission trip.

The Mission team is once again asking our congregation to support disaster relief efforts in Haiti. During September you will have the opportunity to assist in two ways.

Please donate to the September Special Offering for Haitian relief. Funds will be given to
Presbyterian Disaster Relief designated for Haiti. The Mission Team will begin by donating the first
\$500 for the offering. It would be wonderful if donations from the congregation could match or
even surpass this amount! Please mark the memo line: PDR-Haiti.

 The September 26th Noisy Offering will be donated to Presbyterian Disaster Relief designated for the people of Haiti. Bring your coins to make a generous noise (they will be collected in a COVIDsafe way).

GETTING READY FOR CHRISTMAS IN SEPTEMBER! Our donation partner for September is Johnson County Christmas Bureau. Each holiday season, JCCB conducts a Holiday Shop for low-income families, distributes food, collects coats, and fills many other needs for our brothers and sisters in need. JCCB is particularly concerned about hunger in our community this winter and the potential loss of the donations they would normally get from school food drives. They'd love to get canned food items from us to stock their food pantry — things like peanut butter, canned soups, canned tuna and chicken, and canned vegetables.

JCCB has also requested new and gently used children's coats, sizes newborn through boys and girls XXL. Sizes 7-12 are the most needed.
