The September Session meeting started with updates on several health concerns within the congregation. While the Session is the primary business arm of the church, we also keep everyone in prayer. We discussed the fall schedule, including coverage during Karen's study leave in September/October.

The Scrambled Eggs & Stewardship Stories event was discussed at different times during our meeting. Feedback indicated that some people learned a lot about things that happen behind the scenes at Grace Covenant. We may bring back the "team of the month" concept to share what different groups in the church do monthly to help keep that conversation alive. If you were inspired by something that you heard, reach out to that team to find out more about how you can contribute! Thanks to the Generosity Team for planning the event and huge thanks to the members of Connections and Care who set up, served, and cleaned up the food!

Our fall schedule is back in full swing including music and education programs. New tools to help connect people are available including online signups for Sunday School teachers. A wish list for supporting education ministries may be coming soon, too.

All our activities are supported by amazing staff. The Personnel Team has almost finished with staff reviews for 2025 and is discussing the appropriate staff for GCPC as we move forward.

Connections and Care Team will be gathering us for a BBQ at the beginning of October and Facilities Team is trying to schedule a workday — keep your eyes open for a date and time! We will have projects for a variety of ages and skill levels.

Major capital expenses will not be included in the 2026 budget because they don't smooth out as regular monthly expenses. Facilities Team, Finance Team, and the Session are starting to discuss how we will pay for those expenses (including roof work, replacing windows, plumbing projects, and others). Options include using cash surplus/savings, borrowing money, or a capital campaign. If you have thoughts or ideas about funding options, please talk to a member of one of the groups mentioned above.

We appreciate all the work that Deacons, Praise Team, Tech Crew, and others put into making Worship in the Park such a success! We were lucky to have such beautiful weather that morning!

Heart of America CROP Walk

Seventy-five percent of the funds raised by the **October 12 Heart of America CROP Walk** will benefit the work of Church World Service (CWS). A large part of CWS's work deals with refugee assistance and resettlement. That work has been severely impacted by cuts in federal funding, particularly the suspension of the refugee program.

CWS has had to lay off over 150 workers in their New York City office. Many other CWS workers

have been furloughed for varying periods of time. The organization has been unable to access federal reimbursements for critical program costs, further straining its resources. These events have left tens of thousands of vulnerable refugees stranded overseas, unable to resettle in the United States.



There is a heightened need to support CWS through our CROP Walk participation and to be advocates for the vulnerable populations CWS serves. **Please be one of our 40 or more walkers** as we celebrate our 40th year or donate as you can to support CWS. There are two routes, one which is 1.1 miles, and the other at 3.5 miles.

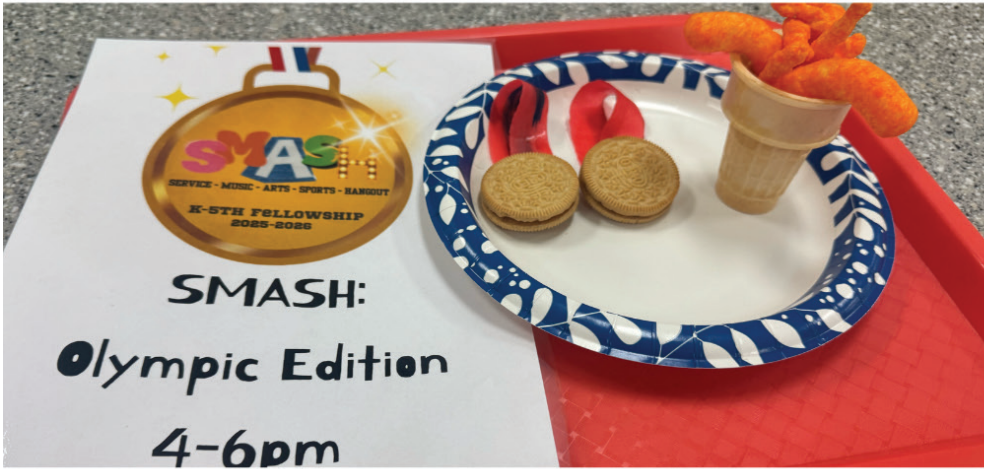
Adult Helpers Needed!

Would you like an easy, low-cost way to lower your carbon footprint?

Consider joining GCPC's composting program!

We partner with KC Can Compost to offer our members the option to compost their household food scraps. For new participants, there's a small sign-up fee to buy a bucket (between \$15–\$35 depending on what options you want), and the cost thereafter is \$13/month. Participating households get the code to unlock the orange bin at the west end of the parking lot and can dump their household compostable waste into it anytime, 24/7. Participants also get some educational materials on what is compostable and what isn't.

As long as we have enough participating households, GCPC gets to compost waste we produce at church for free! The more households participate, the greater our impact will be — GCPC has already diverted more than 2,000 pounds of compostable waste from the landfill.
