THE JUNE COMMUNION OFFERING RECIPIENT will be directed to Johnson County Christmas Bureau. JCCB is a long-time partner of GCPC; every year, they run a 9–10 day Holiday Shop during the month of December. At the Holiday Shop, pre-qualified, low-income Johnson County residents can shop for groceries, personal care items, toys, books, coats and hats, and other items for their families' needs. JCCB also provides packages for low-income nursing home residents, including items such as pajamas, slipper socks, twin bedding, lap quilts, tool belts and walker bags. Find your Christmas spirit in the middle of summer and help JCCB achieve their mission!

UPLIFT IS OUR JUNE MISSION DONATION PARTNER. Uplift provides food and necessities to the Kansas City Homeless by sending four hot-food trucks out Monday, Wednesday and Saturday evenings each week. GCPC has provided hot meals and high-need items for Uplift distribution on the fourth Saturday of each month for nearly 20 years. Each month we truly have fun preparing, cooking and delivering to the UPLIFT distribution teams two large casseroles which feed 60–90 people on that Saturday evening.

Donate High-Need Items: Take a look around your house or clean some closets. Perhaps you'll find some of these current high-need items:

- hygiene items (the homeless don't always have a place to store their stuff, so before you donate that large container of shampoo, think "hotel-sized" bottles of shampoo, lotion, etc.)
- gently used or new seasonal clothing (underwear, shirts, pants, caps, socks)
- camping essentials (tents, sleeping bags, flashlights, batteries, playing cards, etc.)
- EZ open canned food (fruit, spam, ravioli, spaghetti, soups, etc.)

CAN RECYCLING = (ALMOST) FREE MONEY FOR YOUR FAVORITE GCPC TEAM OR MISSION: With our Youth Director's departure, we need a new system for getting the aluminum cans in the can shed to the scrap metal recycler. The good news is, taking cans to the recycler is a source of easy money! The bad news is, we need volunteers to do it. The scrap metal recyclers are located in KCMO, and you need a large vehicle like a truck or van to do it efficiently. (Taking a trunkful of cans in a sedan isn't worth the time it takes to get there and back.) We need to keep up with the cans as they come in so that the volume doesn't become overwhelming.

For the next two months, we'd like to try a pilot program where any interested church member can sign up to take a load of cans each month. Whoever takes the cans in a given month gets to decide where the money for that load goes — you can direct it to your favorite GCPC Ministry Team (like Facilities Team or Children's Team) or to your favorite GCPC mission partner (like IHN or Uplift). The price of aluminum varies, but normally it is from \$50 to \$100 per truckload of cans. At the end of July, we'll determine the success of the pilot program and decide how to move forward.
