While we are waiting, come."



## **CALL TO CONFESSION**

In this season of waiting, we hear Isaiah's promise: "The desert shall rejoice and blossom." Yet our waiting often feels dry and unsure. Like John the Baptist, we ask, "Are you the one?" We carry doubts, impatience, and longing. Still, God meets us there—in the wilderness, in the questions, in the waiting. Trusting in God's renewal, let us come before the Holy One in confession.

### PRAYER OF CONFESSION

God of hope and healing, we confess that we do not wait well. We grow impatient in the wilderness and discouraged when answers don't come quickly. We doubt your presence when life feels barren and forget your promises when the way is unclear. You call us to strengthen weak hands, steady trembling knees, and trust that you are making all things new. Instead, we cling to fear and miss the signs of grace blooming around us.

Forgive us, Lord. Open our eyes to the quiet miracles of renewal. Give us courage to wait with faith, to listen for your voice, and to follow where you lead. In your mercy, make our deserts rejoice again. Amen.

### ASSURANCE OF PARDON

Hear the good news: The God who comes to save does not wait for us to have perfect faith. God meets us in our doubts, lifts us from weariness, and steadies our hearts. Isaiah declares, "Be strong, do not fear! Here is your God." And Jesus proclaims that the blind see, the lame walk, and good news is brought to the poor. In Christ, we are forgiven, renewed, and restored.

Isaiah 35:1-10

### SCRIPTURE LESSON

#### Matthew 11:2–11

When John heard in prison what the Messiah was doing, he sent word by his disciples and said to him, "Are you the one who is to come, or are we to wait for another?" Jesus answered them, "Go and tell John what you hear and see: the blind receive their sight, the lame walk, those with a skin disease are cleansed, the deaf hear, the dead are raised, and the poor have good news brought to them. And blessed is anyone who takes no offense at me." As they went away, Jesus began to speak to the crowds about John: "What did you go out into the wilderness to look at? A reed shaken by the wind? What, then, did you go out to see? Someone dressed in soft robes? Look, those who wear soft robes are in royal palaces. What, then, did you go out to see? A prophet? Yes, I tell you, and more than a prophet. This is the one about whom it is written, 'See, I am sending my messenger ahead of you, who will prepare your way before you.' 

The work of Christmas begins!




