Clerk's Corner

The June Session meeting was a full one.

We approved a request from Youth Team to form a joint Youth group with Village on Antioch for the Fall of 2023 with the possibility of extending it into the spring of 2024 if it is successful. Village on Antioch has approximately the same number of active youth at this time as Grace Covenant has. We discussed the advantage of hiring someone on a very part time basis to coordinate this program and interact with our youth at these activities twice per month. Thanks to Ryan and Emily Hussey for seeing a void and pursuing a way to fill it.

Facilities team brought a prioritized report of large items (>\$10,000 expenditures) that will need to be addressed in the next 15 years (details are elsewhere in this newsletter). Session discussed possible means of financing these projects, which will be referred to Finance Team. Facilities team also brought a proposal for placing Solar Panels at Grace Covenant. Session approved pursuit of this project – i.e. learning more about specific costs, return on investment, and funding options (grants, government rebates, etc.)

Finance team brought an addition to our operations manual regarding reimbursement for approved expenditures. In a nutshell, all expenses much be submitted to the finance office (finance@gcpc.org) within 60 days of the expenditure or by the end of the calendar year in which they were incurred. Paper receipts may be submitted with a form, or members can take a photo of their receipt and submit it via e-mail (copy the approving staff member). See the operations manual if you want more details.

At the end of our meeting, we received the sad news of Mitch and Sue's departure from Grace Covenant. Like much of the congregation, Session was shocked by this news. Rev. Dale Jackson, our Presbyter for Vision and Leadership, joined us for part of the meeting. Dale will be meeting with Session in July and a liaison from Commission on Ministry will be assigned to Grace Covenant to help guide us through this next transition in the life of our Congregation.

Session members are still reeling from this news; but as always, we're happy to talk with you about it (you're also welcome to talk to your Deacon; we will be in regular communication with them). We will know more after our July Session meeting. We anticipate an interim pastor followed by a mission study and a formal search for our next installed pastor, but as we all know, this will take time. We will have a period without a head of staff. We know that WE are the church.... all the people together. God is with each one of us and with us as a congregation. Take some time to process this and to celebrate the ministry the Triggers have had with us. Then we will move forward together.

Getting to know GCPC Committees: Adult Education Team

The Adult Education Team develops and presents programs that ground our faith in well-considered thought and discussion.

Programs fall into four basic categories:

- 1) Prepared courses available from various sources
- 2) The team develops courses based upon our research and accumulated knowledge. The team includes active and retired pastors who are happy to share their years of training and experience.
- 3) Current events (often moderated by knowledgeable members of the congregation)
- Guest speakers (either recruited by the team or suggest by members of the congregation)

We meet monthly and prefer meeting in members' homes rather than the church to further instill fellowship.

We are always happy to welcome more members.



Why Deacons?

As defined in the Book of Order and as set forth in scripture, "the ministry of deacon is one of compassion, witness, and service, sharing in the redeeming love of Jesus Christ for the poor, the hungry, the sick, the lost, the friendless, the oppressed, those burdened by unjust policies or structures, or anyone in distress. Persons of spiritual character, honest repute, and exemplary lives, brotherly and sisterly love, sincere compassion and sound judgment should be chosen for this ministry." In the GCPC operations manual their ministry is under the supervision and authority of the session and shall assume additional duties delegated to them by the session.

While the Book of Order allows for many different tasks to be given to the deacons, GCPC tends to follow Acts 6:1–5, which emphasizes feeding the hungry and caring for those in distress. Care of and for our members is of the utmost importance.

Each deacon is in charge of a Covenant group composed of congregation members and families. The deacon is responsible for communicating with the members of that group to determine and to what extent what care is required for whatever reason: birth, death, surgery or illness. Such care might include telephone calls, emails, texts, cards or visits. Sometimes meals are needed, sometimes additional communication with the pastoral staff is called for. Deacons may share church events, including worship services, fellowship activities and service opportunities. Each Covenant group may organize social activities for that group or in conjunction with other groups. The Deacon's most important duty is to make church members feel included and cared for.

To foster an atmosphere of care and welcome on Sunday morning, the Deacons organize their covenant groups to serve as greeters at the doors and to host and clean up a coffee fellowship hour between the service and Sunday school. In February 2023 the Deacons and Covenants groups shared a brunch to start off the new church year. This replaced the group potluck usually associated with the annual meeting in January. The February date gave the deacons and their groups more time to prepare..

The 10 deacons currently serving are: Maggie Blankers, Barbara Douglas, Cindy Schendel, Nelson Townsend, Gay Lee Ludwig- Bonney, Jody Mason, Jesse Bures/Michelle Gailliez-Frye, Ashley Jeffries, Terra Howard and Jean Hampton. Anne Stroud is the Deacon Moderator.

These people, and many before them, have answered the call to serve in this very important role. Many will express that, while it can be challenging, it can also be incredibly fulfilling. Being a deacon is a true calling to serve Christ. If you get the call to serve in this role, please consider answering it.
