ADULT LENTEN BOOK STUDY: Please join us during the Sunday School hour for a study of *Inhabiting Eden: Christians, the Bible, and the Ecological Crisis* by Dr. Patricia Tull March 5– April 2. In this thoughtful study, respected Old Testament scholar Patricia K. Tull explores the Scriptures for guidance on today's ecological crisis. Tull looks to the Bible for what it can tell us about our relationships, not just to the earth itself, but also to plant and animal life, to each other, to descendants who will inherit the planet from us, and to our Creator. She offers candid discussions on many current ecological problems that humans contribute to, such as the overuse of energy resources like gas and electricity, consumerism, food production systems — including land use and factory farming — and toxic waste. On March 5, we'll discuss the first two chapters, "The Problem of Change, Then and Now" and "Humans and Creation." Nelson Townsend, Jo Randolph, and Mikki Walker will lead these discussions, which all are welcome to attend (even if you haven't read the chapters). OUR FEBRUARY DONATION PARTNER IS GCPC'S OWN LITTLE FREE FOOD PANTRY. If you haven't seen it, this pantry is found on the east end of our property along Nieman Road. We stock the pantry with nonperishable items, and we see these items moving from the pantry each week. Sometimes the pantry is wiped clean. Volunteers check the pantry twice a week and restock as best we can. On occasion, we see donations added to the pantry from within the community as well. - individual drinks or snacks of any kind
