





GRACE COVENANT PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH

Grace Covenant Presbyterian Church: The Story Behind Our Name

As recounted by Jay McKell, Pastor Emeritus, the naming of Grace Covenant Presbyterian Church was a thoughtful and prayerful process. Before the church was officially chartered and the first ordained officers (Elders and Deacons) were elected, a Coordinating Council composed of elected individuals made crucial decisions about the church's future. One of their key tasks was to name the church.

Ginny Wirtz, as the last remaining member of that council, recalls the meetings where various names were suggested. The group proposed both geographic names like College Blvd Presbyterian Church, Hilltop Presbyterian Church, and Crossroads Presbyterian Church, and theological names such as Hope Presbyterian Church, New Spirit Presbyterian Church, Rising Sun Presbyterian Church, Covenant Presbyterian Church, and Grace Presbyterian Church.

After several evenings of discussion and prayer, the council unanimously chose the name Grace Covenant. This name was selected to remind us that God's "Grace" stands at the heart of our church. It reflects the hope that grace would be the cornerstone of our community. The word "Covenant" was included to emphasize that as members, we are bound to one another in faith, love, trust, and commitment.

Thus, Grace Covenant Presbyterian Church was born, carrying with it a name that encapsulates the essence of our faith and fellowship.

The work we've accomplished over 40 years has benefitted thousands of people. Let us continue to help our global and local community and each other for many years to come.










Celebrating our Faithful Journey


