SPOTLIGHT

BEGINNING TODAY, we will enter the season of Advent with the theme "Waiting Well." Waiting does not come easily to most of us. In our hurried world, we prefer what is immediate and visible. Yet waiting — attentive, hopeful waiting — is at the very heart of Advent. It is the season of the "now and not yet," when we live between promise and fulfillment. We begin by contemplating Christ's promised return and then turn toward the story of Mary and Joseph as they waited for the birth of the Christ Child.

THIS ADVENT, OUR DAILY E-MAIL DEVOTIONS, continuing through Christmastide and concluding at Epiphany, are meant to guide us through that sacred waiting. Written from a layperson's perspective and shared with love, each reflection encourages us to engage more deeply with God's Word and to draw near in prayer and contemplation. Each day's entry is accompanied by a piece of visual art and a musical selection — many of which can be found on YouTube — to enrich our time of reflection.
