Awakening to Worship, Our Children's Service

Our Children's Service at Grace Covenant is called Awakening to Worship, and it is offered to children ages four years old through 1st grade. It is based on the books *Young Children and Worship* by Sonja M. Stewart and Jerome W. Berryman and *Following Jesus* by Sonja M. Stewart. The authors believe that, "It involves helping children worship in a special place apart from the worshiping congregation so they become able to worship meaningfully with the congregation".

The service is facilitated by a "storyteller" and "greeters" each week in an inviting and quiet space. **The children learn to:**

- 1. Assemble in God's Name (The Call to Worship, The Greeting, Songs of Praise with sign language)
- 2. Proclaim God's Word (Bible Story, Learn to Pray)
- 3. Give Thanks to God (Preparing the Lord's Table, Prayer of Thanksgiving, The Lord's Prayer, Feast-Communion)
- 4. Go in God's Name (Hymn, Charge, Blessing)

The Bible stories, like "Noah", are told using wooden pieces. The Parables, like "The Mustard Seed," are told using flat pieces. The children also learn stories about "How the Church Tells Time" and "Baptism."

Awakening to Worship is open to children of church members and visitors. We are also looking for new volunteers to worship with our little ones. It is a chance to spend meaningful time with the children of our church. It's an unforgettable experience for all involved.








Grace Covenant Presbyterian Church: The Story Behind Our Name

As recounted by Jay McKell, Pastor Emeritus, the naming of Grace Covenant Presbyterian Church was a thoughtful and prayerful process. Before the church was officially chartered and the first ordained officers (Elders and Deacons) were elected, a Coordinating Council composed of elected individuals made crucial decisions about the church's future. One of their key tasks was to name the church.



Ginny Wirtz, as the last remaining member of that council, recalls the meetings where various names were suggested. The group proposed both geographic names like College Blvd Presbyterian Church, Hilltop Presbyterian Church, and Crossroads Presbyterian Church, and theological names such as Hope Presbyterian Church, New Spirit Presbyterian Church, Rising Sun Presbyterian Church, Covenant Presbyterian Church, and Grace Presbyterian Church.

After several evenings of discussion and prayer, the council unanimously chose the name Grace Covenant. This name was selected to remind us that God's "Grace" stands at the heart of our church. It reflects the hope that grace would be the cornerstone of our community. The word "Covenant" was included to emphasize that as members, we are bound to one another in faith, love, trust, and commitment.

Thus, Grace Covenant Presbyterian Church was born, carrying with it a name that encapsulates the essence of our faith and fellowship.

As we commemorate the 40th anniversary of Grace Covenant Presbyterian Church, we will gather under the uplifting theme of "Celebrating Our Faithful Journey." Anchored by the timeless words of Psalm 100:5, "For the Lord is good and his love endures forever; his faithfulness continues through all generations," this celebration reflects on our rich history, acknowledges our milestones, and rejoices in our growth over the years.

Generosity Team Update - What the Future Holds

As early July has arrived, the Generosity Team would like to recognize the faithful generosity and commitment of the members. Just as stirring, we are at 62.4% of submitted pledges and 45.4% of rollover pledges have been received. Our July bracket numbers show significant increases in the % fulfilled in the last quarter! Our giving total has reached \$61.5% of our budget! We ask everyone to please continue keeping up with summer giving and buck the *summer slack off giving trend*. Message from Member Rick Randolph

On February 24, 2022, Russia invaded Ukraine. It soon became evident that this is a war on the Ukrainian people, not just a war on the Ukrainian state. The wanton killings of civilians, the destruction of civilian infrastructure, and the deliberate destruction of healthcare facilities are unacceptable. Matthew 25 calls us to action for the oppressed and wronged, and I feel a need to help the people impacted by the war.

Through my role in Heart to Heart International's efforts I have helped the Ukrainian people materially. But there are many people in Ukraine in need of caring, personal health care and I felt called to act. I became a family physician to care for people, so I chose to deploy with the Global Care Force to provide personal healthcare in the Ukraine to civilians who are directly impacted by the war.

I will be serving a two-week rotation in the Ukraine, November 3–17. As a military physician, I understand that there is the risk but this WILL NOT be a military rotation. It will be to serve a much greater need to care for civilians, for regular civilians impacted by this unjust "war."

One commitment of working with Global Care Force is that the individual raises money providing for the medication that will be used in Ukraine. I ask you to join me in taking direct action in support of those in the Ukraine impacted by the war by helping to pay for the medication that will be put to use.

Both portions of the 'Olympia Overture' are approved POL-01, which had been divided into two parts, will amend the Book of Order to include sexual orientation and gender identity among the categories against which this Church does not discriminate. 
On Gun Violence Prevention 2024
