COMMUNION OFFERING RECIPIENT IN MARCH — InterFaith Hospitality Network (IHN): Although GCPC stopped participating as a host church with IHN in late 2024, IHN continues to serve clients, helping homeless families and single women gain stability. IHN provides clients with food and housing, and helps them learn to break the cycle of homelessness. During the day, IHN clients either work or stay in the JoCo IHN Family Center, learning essential life and financial skills. IHN guests receive budget counseling, case management, job search assistance, connections to community resources, and education on life, parenting, and coping skills. IHN's program works — more than 70% of the clients who graduate from IHN's program gain sustainable housing! MARCH DONATION PARTNER — **GCPC's Little Free Pantry:** Our donation partner in March is our own Little Free Pantry.
