Bed and Bags - Plastic Bag Sleeping Mats

One option for our Workship Sunday was to prepare plastic yarn to make sleeping mats for our unhoused neighbors sleeping outside. Sarah Stolberg returned for a second year to teach us to prepare bags while she crocheted a mat. It takes 700 to 1,000 bags to make one mat, and about 9 hours to prepare that number of bags into yarn. Sarah can take the prepared yarn and hand knit a sleeping mat in about an hour. Shortly after Workship Sunday, Sarah shared instructions on making a mat so that we can continue this effort with her at GCPC. <u>We need people who</u> <u>are willing to prep bags into yarn.</u> This is a simple task you can do at home and is especially suited for children and youth. Thank you to everyone who donated plastic bags and assisted this year and last. Turn Out Your Pockets for a Noisy Offering — November 10

Our next Noisy Offering will go to help pay down student lunch debt at Rosehill Elementary. During the pandemic, free school lunches were offered to all children nationwide regardless of income, but that program ended in 2022, and many families have struggled with transitioning back to paying for school lunches.

While no student is ever denied a lunch, outstanding debt is eventually sent to collections agencies and school districts have to make up debt that is ultimately unpaid out of funds that would otherwise be used for education. The Shawnee Mission School District has one the highest lunch debt totals in the KC metro area, totaling over \$170,000.

Our Noisy Offering funds will help ease this burden on families at our long-time partner, Rosehill Elementary. Bring your loose change on November 10, and be a part of this GCPC tradition!
