Throughout my career I have known about the importance of multiple intelligences and sticky learning practices in spiritual formation; however, in recent years I have seen these practices increasingly cross into worship. That is a huge step for Reformed churches like the PCUSA! We grew out of a tradition that rejected images of Jesus in the Sanctuary. Our ancestors created worship focused on primarily words. Over time, music became more and more accepted and increasingly participatory. Images of religious symbols became more prevalent and children and youth were welcomed to the Lord's Table. These were important steps, but there is more that can be done!

In January, our congregation observed Baptism of the Lord Sunday by reclaiming our baptismal vows. Each of us dipped our fingers into this beautiful bowl of water. As we did so, breathing in we said, "You have called me by name." Exhaling we said, "I am yours. I am baptized." It was a tangible way to remember a covenant that is ours throughout our lives.

I am yours.
I am baptized.

One of the best moments of that service was when the children came forward for their time together. Some of the children dipped their fingers again as they walked by the bowl to the front of the Sanctuary. What a wonderful way to feel included in the practices of the church!

This month, our second grade children will encounter the other Sacrament, The Sacrament of Communion, in the **Gather at the Table** workshops I will be leading. (See article on the right.) Together, parents and children will experience God's love in bread broken and a cup of juice. They are simple practices, but they can touch our hearts in profound ways. I wonder what other ways we might be able to incorporate more tangible practices in our worship and in our daily lives. I invite you to wonder with me. If you have an idea, please share it with me.

Outreach Notes

Grace Covenant will host homeless IHN guests during IHN week February 3–10. Thank you to the volunteers who will be hosting and providing meals this week. We ask you to pray for our guests.

Many thanks to those of you who served at KCK Hot Lunch program in November and December 2018. We served 248 meals in November, 374 meals in December, and a total of 2,724 meals in 2018!

Christmas International House (CIH)

In December 2018, members of GCPC hosted six of eleven international students in the Kansas Christmas International House (CIH) program. For the past 14 years, Grace Covenant has partnered with Village Presbyterian Church to provide 12–15 college students a place to stay for two weeks during their college's semester break. Hosts this year were the Purvis, Knoche and Bond families.

Our students came from various universities across the United States and are from India, South Korea, China, Japan, Malaysia, and Pakistan. You may have seen some of them at worship on December 23, 24, or 30. Among the various activities planned for the students this year were the Nelson-Atkins Museum of Art, the National World War I Museum and Memorial, Pickleball, volunteering at Thelma's Kitchen, ice skating, bowling, a Western Party, an international potluck, and a New Year's Eve Party. The Western Party included line dances, and square dances. Our Mission Team supported the effort by providing the pizzas. The students embraced the evening activities by wearing "experienced" square dance clothes.

In 2018 we allotted \$2000 to mission giving. Each circle decided where to give \$500. Recipients received from \$100 to \$250. The recipients were: Red Bag, Safe Home, Free Hot Soup, Books for Rwanda (Lukas McCamon's school), SowHope, Johnson County Christmas Bureau, Heart to Heart International, Happy Bottoms, Presbyterian Disaster Assistance for Disaster Relief Refugees Emergencies in the US, and Mission and Music (GC Youth) Auction.



PRESBYTERIANS AROUND THE WORLD

Discovering the Arapaho - Part VI

Do you know that the Presbyterian Church(USA) has Native American churches that operate within designated synods? For these churches, the 223rd General Assembly (2018) "Doctrine of Discovery: A Review of Its Origins and Implications for Congregations in the PC (USA) and Support for Native American Sovereignty" has significant meaning. The 2014 publication, the *Native*



American Congregational Support Directory, lists the names of Native American churches in each Synod and Presbytery. For example, the Dakota Presbytery, within the Synod of Lakes and Prairies, identifies 20 Native American churches. Since 2014, these numbers may have changed. According to the 223rd General Assembly, there are 95 Native American churches in the PC(USA). This number represents a decrease of 15 churches since the General Assembly Task Force Report in 2000.

The General Assembly report in 2018 on the Doctrine of Discovery recommends that the PC(USA) "Go beyond repudiation" of the Doctrine of Discovery. To enhance this recommendation, the 2018 General Assembly report includes the following statement: "It is essential to replace the colonial Doctrine of Discovery with contemporary international human rights standards and engage in just and collaborative processes of redress."

A vital section of the 2018 report called "How PC(USA) congregations can support Native Americans in their ongoing effort for sovereignty and human rights," describes 18 actions that leadership organizations on all levels of the PC(USA) and members can take to implement these supportive measures. The following list contains two of these actions:

- Item 13: Direct the Presbyterian Mission Agency to include the Doctrine of Discovery and the histories of Indigenous peoples and current issues facing Indigenous peoples in its antiracism training efforts.
- Item 18: Support funding for the Native American Consulting Committee so that it can fully carry out its role in serving as a consulting body for the denomination on issues of Native American ministry and issues regarding Native Nations.

Clerk's Corner

Session met on January 21, 2019 in room 5, with Reverend Mitch Trigger serving as moderator. In addition to the elders, Deacon Meredith Watson was present. Reverend Sue Trigger was excused since she'd had surgery on the preceding Friday.

Team minutes: Tim Hayden reported that the Mission team wants to have a party sometime in the spring to mark the 25th anniversary of the partnership between the Maya Quiche and Heartland presbyteries, as well as celebrate the commitment to another 5 years. More details will follow. It's possible that Welcoming team will be involved too.

Aaron Soule reported that the Finance team reviewed the insurance coverage on the church's facilities. Aaron also reported there will be a discussion about pledge receipts at the annual meeting, followed by letters to the congregation. The cutoff date for submitting a pledge to be included in the budget discussions will be February 10. Session approved operating under last year's budget figures until the new budget is in place.

KDO tuition increases were approved: enrollment fee from \$65 to \$75; half-day program – from \$75 to \$80/month; full-day program – from \$110 to \$120/month. This brings KDO rates in line with other programs in the area.

Consent agenda: The minutes of the December Session meeting and several membership requests were approved (total membership is now 494). Session approved February 23, 2019 as the Visioning Day and the Elder on Duty program has been reinstated with updated responsibilities.

Deacons' report: Meredith Watson reported that the deacons were trained at their retreat last weekend. They are all looking forward to the annual meeting and potluck.

Old business: Session heard a report from the Nominating Team.

New business: Reverend Mitch Trigger, Nelson Townsend and Cheryl Johnson will work on updating the GCPC bylaws so they can be approved at the congregational meeting to be held in May to elect new elders. Reverends Sue and Mitch are going to work with the deacons to train them to offer communion to homebound members. After sharing some joys and concerns of the congregation, Mitch closed the meeting in prayer and the meeting adjourned at 8:35pm.
