GRACE NOTES

Thanks be to God it's finally April!

Too many of us have faced some difficult experiences the last couple of months. Some of us have had mothers, fathers, family members, and friends pass away; some of us have had loved ones dealing with cancer treatments, surgeries, and the uncertainty of the future; some of us have had to face personal challenges. It's easy for us to be overwhelmed with grief or anxiety, even easier when it's grey, cloudy, and wet outside. I don't know about you, but I've needed it to be April for a while now, and with it, Easter. It's no accident that Easter is in the spring. It's the season when the Earth is renewed and much of nature comes to life. It's also a time when it can be easier to feel...hope.

Holy Week wraps all of our feelings and life experiences into one short time period. Maundy Thursday is a reminder of what it's like to say goodbye to loved ones, Good Friday shows us the grief associated with death, and then comes Easter – the assurance that grief, sorrow, and death to not have the last word.

At Grace Covenant, a long-time tradition is the "flowering of the cross" on Easter Sunday, when everyone attending places a flower on the cross. The flowering of the cross represents the transition from Good Friday to Easter, from meditation on Jesus' death to joyful celebration of his resurrection. The ceremony transforms a barren cross, a reminder of Jesus' death, into an Easter symbol. Covered with flowers, the cross serves not only as an emblem of Jesus' resurrection but also of the continuing presence of Christ among today's believers.

"Therefore, we were buried together with him through baptism into his death, so that just as Christ was raised from the dead through the glory of the Father, we too can walk in newness of life. If we were united together in a death like his, we will also be united together in a resurrection like his." (Romans 6:4-5)

We are reminded that we have the promise of a resurrected life, a life that is already known by the loved ones who have gone before us.

Thank God for the hope of Easter!


