JOIN THE ADULT CLASS ON SUNDAY, SEPTEMBER 15, FOR DIVIDING LINES: A HISTORY OF SEGREGATION IN KANSAS CITY. This session will focus on how local, state, and federal government acted to keep Kansas City segregated throughout past decades and even now. As a

bonus to this class, you are encouraged to download VoiceMap from your favorite app store or the link below. This application includes a number of guided tours of interest to those who live in the metropolitan area. Beginning at Shawnee Mission East, the app will lead you through Prairie Village to Mission Hills then into Missouri where housing patterns have been impacted intentionally to separate people of color from the more privileged white families.



The tour will require about two hours of time with views of Troost, the Paseo, 18th and Vine, and many other locations that result from actions in Kansas City's history.
