JULY DONATION PARTNER — SAFEHOME: Safehome is a domestic violence shelter in Overland Park. Their core purpose is to provide a healing atmosphere where survivors of domestic violence can gain inner strength, explore options, and be empowered to live a life free of abuse. As the only domestic violence shelter in Johnson County, and the largest in the state of Kansas, Safehome strives to break the cycle of domestic violence and partner abuse for victims and their children in our community. Besides providing safe housing, Safehome also provides mental health counseling and legal services for shelter residents. Operating the shelter requires all the necessity of daily life for the women and children housed in it, many of whom leave their abusers with nothing but the clothes on their backs. You can help Safehome execute their important mission by donating an item from the list below; just leave donations in the Weekday Entrance bin anytime during July. JULY COMMUNION OFFERING RECIPIENT: The Communion Offering for July will be directed to the Pentecost Offering. Faith and Hope Campaign Update

Our \$50,000 Faith and Hope Campaign has one additional pledge since May! Thank you for your supplemental pledge! That makes 35 members/households who have come forward with a supplemental pledge amount. As of June 19, 2023, 44.6% of our goal has been raised for a total of \$22,335.
