PRESBYTERY LOCK-IN AT CHAPEL HILL: Heartland Presbytery is hosting an All-Presbytery Youth Lock-In on Friday, April 21 at Chapel Hill Presbyterian Church, beginning at 6pm with dinner and concluding Saturday morning no later than 10am, following breakfast and a final gathering. This event is for 6th–12th grade youth and will include meals, energizers, games, music, ice breakers, outdoor events (weather permitting), vespers and a movie. BAKER/REYNOLDS SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION EXTENSION: Youth Team has extended the application date for the Baker/Reynolds Award (formerly titled the Reggie Reynolds Scholarship). MISSION

MARCH DONATION PARTNER - ARROWHEAD DAY SCHOOL PERSONAL HYGIENE ITEMS: GCPC will collect toothpaste, toothbrushes, shampoo, deodorant, and feminine hygiene products for students at Arrowhead Day School as part of the school's Caring for Kids partnership. Arrowhead Day School is located at 66th and Santa Fe in Overland Park and is Shawnee Mission School District's response for children and youth who need a caring, compassionate educational setting. Students come from throughout the Shawnee Mission School District and range in age from elementary through high school. Personal hygiene items will help support student needs as school staff work to bring about appropriate social and behavioral practices. Drop off your donations of these items in the Weekday Entrance bins during the month of March.

MARCH COMMUNION OFFERING RECIPIENT - INTERFAITH HOSPITALITY NETWORK (IHN): For many years, GCPC has hosted guests from the Interfaith Hospitality Network, a homelessness intervention program that helps restore stability to situationally homeless families in Johnson County. IHN has fed, housed, educated and empowered hundreds of wonderful people, thanks to their network of congregations and individual supporters. Last year, more than 75% of IHN guests obtained permanent housing after 90 to 180 days with us. Communion Offering in March will help support IHN's mission.

GCPC + GOOD FAITH NETWORK

In February, Session voted for GCPC to join the Good Faith Network, an interfaith group composed of 25+ congregations across three faith traditions in Johnson County. The Good Faith Network's mission is to pursue justice around our local community's most pressing problems. This year, the Good Faith Network is working on solutions to mental health, housing, and homelessness in Johnson County. The membership fee was funded partially by donations from members; we're also seeking some supplementary PCUSA grant funding. (Further donations would be welcome from anyone else who wants to support our participation in this work!)

We are seeking GCPC members who are interested in participating in this work. Anyone who is interested is invited to schedule a 30-minute meet-up with the organization's lead staff person, Aileen Ball. These meetings will be informal conversations that let Aileen learn more about us and our congregation, as well as letting you ask any questions you may have about Good Faith Network. Attending a meeting does not create any obligation to participate further unless you want to!
