We also heard a presentation from Heartland Presbytery's Commission on Ministry about the Mission Study that will be conducted by our Transition Team. The guidelines are less prescriptive than they have been in the past. Karen is ready to start assembling a Transition Team — if you are interested in being a part of the team, please let Karen or a Session member know. Karen is already planning several activities during and around worship this summer which will kick off the work of the Transition Committee. (Note: The Transition Team is NOT the aroup that will search for our next Pastor, although we may have one or two members of this team roll over into that search committee. The Pastor Nominatina Committee will be called by the church nominating committee and elected by the congregation once we have completed our Mission study.)

Work on the elevator repairs has started but is slowed by a wait for parts. Finance Team continues to try to move our funds into accounts that will be more lucrative and accessible to us.

A huge thanks goes out to Tara Hyder who has been working with JCCC and finally secured payments that they owed us for use of our building over the last few years! Arrangements have been made for them to start making those payments each semester.

We look forward to worshiping in the park on Sunday, August 4, followed by a potluck and fellowship.

The Session has given authorization to Rick Randolph to fundraise through the congregation for his upcoming medical aid trip to the Ukraine.

The Director of Christian Education search team continues is work; candidates are few and the interviews have not yielded an appropriate candidate yet. They continue to pursue new avenues for candidates.


Session will not have a stated meeting in July.














Thursday Morning Bible Study Group -Summer

82nd IHN Hosting August 4-11

We are planning and preparing for our 82nd IHN host week August 4-11th. On August 4th, we will welcome 2 families to stay overnight at Grace Covenant for the week. In the past 20 years our church has been blessed to lift up over 922 individuals, 529 of those have been children. As of June 2024, our network has worked together to provide 59,608 bednights and 178,824 meals!

Our downstairs will be converted to 2 bedrooms and one host bedroom. With our off-site worship on Sunday August 4th, we will be able to set up on Saturday August 3rd. Jane Knoche is the lead Primary Coordinator for this week. We are looking forward to having the elevator back in working condition by then. Look for the hosting, meals, laundry, and setup/teardown emails coming this month!!


IHN Transition Plan

This month we received an email from IHN Executive Director Vicki Dercher, titled IHN Transition Plan. 20 years ago, there was no community-based housing for the situationally homeless in Johnson County. That's when JOCO IHN started with 13 congregations rotating weekly hosting. We have faithfully participated in this undertaking for 20 years. The Transition plan will close the Family Center by July 31st when the lease ends, and will accept two families and no single women as guests. Staff will go down to about 1.5 and work remotely. The fundraising gala will not be held. Interviews will be scheduled for a public location like a library. Guests will be in churches for 5 weeks and hotels for 8 weeks. Your primary coordinators project having up to six more rotations at GCPC. We will still have our August 24, November 24, February 25, and May 25 host weeks. We'll see how the construction schedule works out and will be willing, as needed, for rotations for the balance of 2025. There will also be no more grant writing, so Vicki Dercher is counting on our generous monetary support to cover the hotel week costs. Some of the factors behind this decision is the fact that our volunteers are aging out that have been engaging with the program and that we've lost eight host congregations.

The need for IHN is much like our aluminum can collection efforts. There was no curbside recycling in place in Johnson County for beer or soda cans. We brought our aluminum cans here and the youth would get the benefit when they turned the aluminum in for money. Curbside recycling is easily available now. No need to bring cans to the church.

As you have heard through the Good Faith Network, the former La Quinta Hotel & Denny's restaurant at I-35 and 95th street are going to be repurposed for a no-barrier Johnson County homeless shelter and for transitional housing. Construction is targeted for Summer 2025 completion. Jane Knoche likens the IHN Transition Plan announcement *"to we have been running a marathon, and now we see our victory lap coming up in the next 12 months."*

"Cooked - Survival by Zip Code" Friday Night Movie Screening July 12th, 6:30 - 8:30pm, Choir Room

KAIROS (GCPC's peace, justice, and environment team), will host a community screening of the award-winning documentary "Cooked - Survival by Zip Code" based on the book "HEAT WAVE: A Social Autopsy of Disaster in Chicago" by Eric Klinenberg. The book and this documentary provide a social autopsy of the 1995 heat wave in Chicago. Join us on July 12th, at 6:30pm in the choir room for viewing with group discussion afterward.

As we experience increased heat waves across the nation, the Chicago deadly heat wave of 1995 that killed over 700 people provides a precautionary tale. The Chicago disaster demonstrates that social isolation and poverty contributed to deaths making particular neighborhoods more deadly than others. While many are aware of the Great Chicago Fire in October of 1871 that killed over 300 people, they may have no memory of the 1995 Chicago heat wave that killed more than twice as many. According to a 2022 USA Today article, heat waves are the nation's deadliest natural disaster, killing more people each year than hurricanes, tornadoes, floods, blizzards, or extreme cold combined. With climate change, it is predicted that the heat will only get worse making these types of disasters even more common.

July Communion Offering Recipient

The Communion Offering for July will be directed to the Pentecost Offering. A gift to the Pentecost Offering helps the church encourage, develop, and support its young people, and also address the needs of at-risk children. 40% of the Pentecost offering can be retained by individual congregations wanting to make an impact in the lives of young people within their own community. The remaining 60% is used to support children-at-risk, youth, and young adults through ministries of the Presbyterian Mission Agency.

Astute observers will note that the 2024 Mission Calendar indicates that Pentecost Offering would be collected in June, and the July Communion Offering would be directed to the Presbyterian Mission agency. But the publicity in June accidentally indicated that the Communion Offering that month would go to Presbyterian Mission, so the Pentecost Offering is being collected in July.

As the only domestic violence shelter in Johnson County, and the largest in the state of Kansas, Safehome strives to break the cycle of domestic violence and partner abuse for victims and their children in our community. Besides providing safe housing, Safehome also provides mental health counseling and legal services for shelter residents.

Operating the shelter requires all the necessity of daily life for the women and children housed in it, many of whom leave their abusers with nothing but the clothes on their backs.

Communion Offering Totals for January-May 2024

Each month, GCPC designates an organization as the Communion Offering Partner - members can donate to the designated organization in each month through the church office. The totals received for January through May appear below. A few explanatory notes:
