Although GCPC does a pretty good job of living up to these signs, we still thought it worth sharing. Enjoy!

# Remember the faith that unites us, the faith we have in a loving and empowering God.

We have faith that God has called us here for a purpose. Whenever we feel the most anxious about the future, let's remember some of the signs of healthy congregations and pledge to live that way:

**Expressing gratitude.** Pay attention to the work done by many people within our congregation. No one person or group of persons does it all, and every person's contribution to our life together is worthy of appreciation. Gratitude is a sign of resurrection living, a way of celebrating our life together.

**Keeping promises.** These include the promises we make both as individuals and as a congregation. For instance, every member of the congregation promises to abide by the decisions made by the Session; elders and deacons make promises to serve the other members and to respect each other. We are obligated to keep our promises. At the same time, we realize that as human beings, we will make mistakes and sometimes break our promises. That's why forgiveness is an important part of being a Christian and the chance to try again.

**Living truthfully.** One of the hardest parts of "truth telling" is when we have to speak hard truths to each other. We have the responsibility to be compassionate, but to not shy away from speaking truthfully to each other, especially when it comes to our life together as a Christian community.

<u>Offering hospitality.</u> This is one of the hallmarks of the Christian faith. True hospitality means welcoming people without them having to earn our welcome. It means welcoming strangers, but it also means continuing to welcome people after they become part of our faith family, and not taking anyone for granted.

Keep living this way and we'll not only overcome our anxieties about the future, but we'll be a shining example of what a Christ-filled community looks like. And that's not a bad thing to be.

# **Pew Dwellers' Health Notes**

#### **Two Health Questions - Part IV**

Previous articles in this series described specific aspects of family history, ethnicity/race, age, weight, and inactivity as risk factors for the development of type 2 diabetes. Another risk factor, the metabolic syndrome, is the focus of this article.



The process of metabolism includes a set of chemical reactions that occur in the cells of the body. Two examples of these chemical reactions are digestion and the movement of substances from one cell to another. The metabolic syndrome is a cluster of metabolic conditions that could increase the risk for the development of type 2 diabetes. According to the second edition of the "Mayo Clinic The Essential Diabetes Book," the presence of three or more of these risk factors may indicate the existence of the metabolic syndrome.

The Mayo Clinic does not specify that any one or combination of certain factors place an individual at greater risk. The five factors include abdominal obesity, blood pressure, high - density lipoprotein cholesterol, fasting blood glucose, and triglycerides. Consultation with a health care provider and completion of additional diagnostic tests may help clarify the meaning of symptoms. This article includes more information about abdominal obesity.

The Mayo Clinic emphasizes the importance of exercise and explains that it helps with absorption of most of the glucose in the blood. Exercise helps to build muscle mass, which absorbs the glucose and burns it for energy. For individuals who are overweight or obese, the additional fatty tissue increases the resistance of the muscles and tissues to the body's own insulin. This situation, according to the Mayo Clinic, *"Is especially true when the excess weight is concentrated around the abdomen."*

#### **Mission and Music Trip Update**

This year we are headed for the gulf coast of Texas where we will serve with Presbyterian Disaster Relief to help those who have struggled with severe hurricane damage over the past year and a half.
