#### **SCRIPTURE LESSON**

Colossians 3:1–2, 8–11 (CEB)

Now set aside these things, such as anger, rage, malice, slander, and obscene language. Don't lie to each other. Take off the old human nature with its practices and put on the new nature, which is renewed in knowledge by conforming to the image of the one who created it. 


