These are more than just words. They describe an attitude, a way of looking at life that is all too rare in our world today.

The attitude I often see online and on television, however, is very different. Too many people look at the world today and feel slighted, feel that for some reason they're not getting everything they're entitled to, and they look for someone to blame. We see it in the divisions between people from different regions of the country, people in rural and urban areas, people from different ethnic backgrounds, sometimes even divisions between family members. Now I'll be the first to say that there really are some vast inequalities between certain segments of society and they stem from long-term inequality. These divisions are contrary to the kingdom of God which is supposed to be our priority, a society where *"The one who gathered more didn't have too much, and the one who gathered less didn't have too little."* (2 Cor. 8-15)

If all of us were to be more intentional about living in gratitude, something Jesus encouraged us to do, we might understand how blessed most of us have been in our lives and focus on those blessings. Living in gratitude is not just mentally taking inventory of our blessings, but also taking the time to express gratitude. Do we tell our "significant others" often enough how lucky we are to have them in our lives? Do we express appreciation of our friends in conversation with each other? Do we thank those that we know have been praying for us in difficult times? As writer William Arthur Ward shared, "God gave you a gift of 84,600 seconds today. Have you used one of them to say thank you?"

Thanks be to God from whom all blessings flow, and just as big a "thanks" to each and every one of you who allows your pastors, church staff, and many church members to follow God's guidance and allow us to do ministry for you and for each other.

A Song-filled Advent/Christmas!

You probably read this title and thought, "we always have a song-filled Advent/Christmas at Grace Covenant" and you'd be right. But this title describes our Advent sermon series **The Songs of Christmas – a look at the biblical songs in the story of Jesus' birth.**

A lot of Scripture passages are the words of songs sung by prophets, kings, messengers, and more, but we don't recognize them that way – they don't read or look like songs we know. That may be true, but they are songs just the same and there are songs that mark the important moments in the story of Jesus' birth found in the Gospel of Luke.

Church Finance Discussion

Air Conditioner Status Report

The air conditioners that were stolen or drained or effectively destroyed in May were replaced in June for around \$160,000+. The insurance company paid \$60,000 initially. Mike Mattix, with help from our insurance contractor and insurance agent, convinced the insurance company to pay for the entire cost less our \$2,500 deductible. The check for the remainder of approximately \$98,781 was deposited in early October. In the final analysis, the church has 5 new air conditioners and the related heat exchangers with new compatible furnaces at the price of a couple of hot Sunday services and \$2,500.

Operating Budget

The month of September was a little disappointing. Revenue was \$14,700 below budget, primarily due to a lack of pledged and rollover pledge receipts. Pledged receipts still are ahead of budget for the year to date. Several members paid their pledges early in the year, which impacts the last few months negatively. Expenses were over budget by approximately \$4,000. This is due to the fact that there were three paydays in September, not the usual two. This happens twice a year when the biweekly payroll falls on the first day or two of the month. The net result was a \$21,186 deficit for the month. Compare that to a \$1,600 deficit projected in the budget for September.

For the year to date, to the first few days of October, *(after recording the receipt of the last insurance check)*, the church is approximately \$50,000 in excess of receipts over disbursements. There is a good chance that the church will operate at breakeven for the full year. A sizable deficit was projected in our initial budget.

Investments

One final note: after several straight years of impressive gains, our investment loss in our endowment and reserve funds is an impressive \$99,186 this year. The combined balance of all of our invested funds (excluding our operating cash account) is \$553,043.70.




