**SEPTEMBER DONATION PARTNER** — **THE STARFISH PROJECT:** The Starfish Project is a nonprofit in Olathe that works to help meet the basic needs of the community. They provide food, clothing, toiletries, haircuts, vision and dental screenings, services to help keep kids in school and grown-ups employed, training for new social workers, and more. They currently serve over 2,000 people a month! Please consider helping Project Starfish achieve their mission by donating any of the items below.
