

NEW COORDINATOR NEEDED FOR UPLIFT MEALS: The Page Turners book group has prepared meals for Uplift, a KC homeless relief agency, for nearly 30 years. Lee Mattix is retiring from her long service as coordinator of those efforts — thank you Lee! — and a new coordinator needs to be identified for GCPC to continue to be involved in this mission work. The coordinator would organize the work of many volunteers to plan, shop for, and prepare a casserole-type meal in the church kitchen, and then deliver it

in thermal containers (provided by Uplift) on the 4th Saturday of each month. The funding is provided as part of the Mission Team budget. Lee would share the benefit of her experience and provide her extensive notes and expertise to the new coordinator, plus many of the members of Page Turners would continue as volunteers (although new volunteers are also needed and welcome).
