GENEROSITY FULFILLMENT JUNE 2025 UPDATE — **Generosity through the Generations:**_The figures are in for Grace Covenant's generosity through May 2025. The Generosity Team is happy to share our 2025 fulfillment number as of June 6. We have received nearly 45% of our total pledges and only 42% of this year has gone by us. We are appreciative of everyone who has contributed to Grace Covenant. Here is our progress shown by numbers of pledges:
