## A Joyous Advent and Christmas Season to All!

It is hard for us to believe, but we have come to the end of another year. It doesn't seem all that different from the beginning of 2022 when we had our final brief suspension of in-person worship. Today we're hearing news of increased cases of influenza, RSV, and COVID, and many of us are going back to wearing masks in public, as much for the health of loved ones and friends as for ourselves. With the continued news of violence around the world, mass shootings in the USA, and political division and in-fighting, it would be easy to overlook and fail to appreciate the true gift of Christmas.

As Christians, we celebrate this season for the gift God gave us in his Son, Jesus. That is not as simple as it sounds. People who don't regularly attend church will find themselves attending services during the holidays, especially on Christmas Eve. Even people who will never set foot inside a church will be glad it's Christmas time. It's because there is a feeling associated with this time of year that we all need – hope.

Sometimes Christians complain that Christmas has become too commercialized and that we're missing the real meaning of Christmas. Yet we've found that in the stories about Santa Claus or Rudolph or even the Grinch, there are messages that reflect what the birth and life of Jesus was all about. They are stories that show people learning to care for each other, people learning to respect each other in spite of (and because of) their differences, and people learning that to be truly happy is based on more than just receiving presents. They are stories that remind us of what we all truly want this world to be like. Our job – yours and ours – is to share the message with everyone that this world they long for, a world of peace and justice and love, is possible because of the birth of a tiny child. A very special child.

We hope that this season of beginnings will be a time of new beginnings for all of us. As we celebrate Christ's birth, may we all feel renewed in our hopes and strive to make our families, our church, and our community true reflections of God's love for us and hope for us. As we celebrate the season and give presents to one another, please remember to give a very important present. As the last verse of the Christmas carol "In the Bleak Midwinter" puts it so eloquently....

"What can I give him, poor as I am?
If I were a shepherd, I would bring a lamb.
If I were a wise man, I would do my part,
Yet what I can, I give him: Give my heart."

May the knowledge of the love of God be with you all and with those you love. —Mitch & Sue

## A Song-filled Advent!

You probably read this title and thought, "we always have a song-filled Advent/Christmas at Grace Covenant" and you'd be right. But this title describes our Advent sermon series The Songs of Christmas – a look at the biblical songs in the story of Jesus' birth.

A lot of Scripture passages are the words of songs sung by prophets, kings, messengers, and more, but we don't recognize them that way – they don't read or look like songs we know. That may be true, but they are songs just the same and there are songs that mark the important moments in the story of Jesus' birth found in the Gospel of Luke.

Exploring these biblical songs will only add to our musical emphasis during the Season of Advent.

## **The Longest Night**

(Blue Christmas)

#### Sunday, December 18, 7pm

The Christmas season is often marked by expressions of joy, excitement, and happiness. It's a time for family to gather and for churches to worship pointing to the hope that is found in the coming of the Christ child. However, this time of joy and expectation can often overshadow the pain and hurt many experience during this season, when the world's merriment puts their grief and sorrow in stark relief.

One of the greatest acts of pastoral care in the Advent season is to offer a service known as a Service of the Longest Night or a Blue Christmas Service. It's a worship service scheduled around the winter solstice (the longest night of the calendar year) and it just happens to fall on or around December 21st every year. There's a connection between the long nights just before Christmas, and the struggle with darkness and grief faced by those living with loss. This service is not only for those of us grieving the loss of a loved one, but also for those people facing the challenges of illnesses, troubles with relationships or work situations, or any other difficulty that makes it hard to be joyful.

Including this service amid the hustle and bustle of your other Christmas services, rituals, parties, and obligations is a tremendous witness to those who are struggling in our community. It's a witness to them that the Christ child comes as a sign of hope in the face of despair. And it's a witness that their church is intentional about upholding members of the community in whatever season of life they may find them.

## Clerk's Corner

**Session met on November 21.** We heard many reports and took a few actions.

Here are some of the highlights:

Music Team is prepared for the fact that Katie Hearn will have a baby about the time that Rebecca Prater has surgery. Most plans for the first quarter are in place already. Patrick O'Halloran will direct choirs in Rebecca's absence and Celia Nicholas and Kathy Bures have agreed to fill any team leadership voids that might occur.

Finance Team has started looking at budget requests from teams and are anticipating needing about \$840,000 to meet those requests as opposed to \$707,000 last year. They will have a budget for Session to consider at the December meeting. Session passed resolutions allowing for Aaron Soule (*Treasurer*) and Terri Monrad (*Trustee*) to receive duplicates of the bank statements for our general accounts and Bob Bonney (*Endowment Moderator*) to receive duplicate bank statements for our endowment fund account. This is simply good practice so that our Finance Secretary is not the only person who sees the statements on a regular basis.

**Generosity Team** has received 67 pledges totaling \$392,581 as of November 20.

Facilities Team delivered a "state of the building" report, summarizing tasks achieved in 2022 and listing project to come in 2023. Two significant projects will be updating our Fire Protection System (which is currently not behaving properly) and addressing the humidity and mold issues on the lower level before summer.

Nominating Team is working on finding Deacons to serve in the new year. Because we've had a few Deacons stay on for an extra year and had a gap, they are currently seeking SIX members to serve as Deacons for the next term. Please consider prayerfully when they call.

**Personnel Team** reported the resignation of Daniel Cole. His last Sunday with us will be December 11. Session passed a motion from Personnel team adding Juneteenth as a staff holiday.

**The Annual Meeting** will be held on January 29, 2023, right after worship.

Visioning Day will be held on February 4, from 9-noon. We seem to have some momentum going as a congregation, so this is an opportunity to set goals and evaluate the resources we have (and need) to achieve those goals.

A message shared in our November 20th Sunday Service, during the Stewardship Time **from Dave Sutherland**, chair of Generosity Team.

So we've had a big bump in the number of pledges made in the past week. Thank you very much, it is very much appreciated from all of us on the Generosity team.

There are two more weeks to go until we lock in the pledges. We've been working with the Finance team to get ready a budget ready for Session in December.

One thing we have been looking at too, is how people have been giving this year. So our financial system breaks it down by those who have not given anything against their pledge this year, 0%, 1-25%, 26-50%, 51%-75%, 76%-99% and 100%. My wife Susan and I are in the 76% - 99% since we give monthly. Once next month hits, we will bump to the 100%. We do have a number of people who are still at 0%, both people who rolled over their pledge and people who also submitted a pledge. So please if you are able to, catch up as best you can. If you can't, let us know. That's okay too, we understand all circumstances. It helps us to take into account when we do the rollovers this year, should we count that as a rollover if you are unable to give this last year.


