What is the story we tell?

I have heard from a few of you some of the stories of your experience at Grace Covenant. I look forward to more of them. In the past few weeks, we have experienced stories of the youth and children as they have led and participated in worship. We have also seen the generational nature of Grace Covenant as Wyatt was baptized and his grandmother was the elder who presented him. We have heard stories of new beginnings and Pentecost. We have heard Isaiah say "Here I am, send me."

We will begin a summer sermon series on June 23rd that will span the entire summer, entitled "Telling Our Story." We will spend three weeks looking at lament. This is to give time to grieve what has been lost or has never come to fruition. A key element of lament is that in bringing complaints and sorrow to God, there is always a turn to hope and a reminder of God's promises to us. We will participate in some interactive elements to share laments such as ripping cloth, using dissolving paper, and making a banner out of our laments.

Once we have time to grieve parts of our stories, we will look at how God is at work re-forming and re-shaping us. How are we molded like the potter molds clay? How are we transformed from the inside out, and how do we have the courage to make the changes needed in moving forward? Finally, we will ponder what God is calling Grace Covenant to be in the next chapter of her story. What does it mean for us to be gathered as a community of faith? How are we being equipped for ministry and what is the Spirit sending us out to do in the world today?

Our stories point out what we value and we can learn a lot about ourselves from them. As we gather stories and memorabilia for the 40th Anniversary – Save the Date for June 22, 2025 – and as we seek to begin the mission study part of the transition, stories can help identify what are the core values of the congregation and what God has called GCPC to do in the world and what God is calling GCPC to do and to be in the coming years ahead.

Transition Update

To answer some questions about the process, a PNC has not yet been elected. There are steps in the process to work through before we get there.

We hope to begin the Mission Study piece this summer and are talking with the Committee on Ministry for Heartland Presbytery about it. This will involve a team of GCPC members who will be tasked with gathering information from the congregation and in a nutshell, writing the current story of the congregation. After that work is done the PNC is elected and we move into the next phase of the process.

Please continue to pray for GCPC and prayerfully consider how you might be involved with the Mission Study or later with the PNC.



Clerk's Corner

Your Session met on May 20 at 7pm. One major topic of discussion was changes to the PCUSA Board of Pensions which will impact how much we are contributing to any/all Pastors' salaries starting in 2025. This is an item which is beyond our control, but the Session and Personnel Team are aware of it and will include it in future budgeting.

So far, our finances for 2024 are looking pretty good, but our aging facility continues to provide challenges.

Pressing issues include HVAC, water heaters, the elevator, the garbage disposal and dishwasher on the lower level, and building security. We appreciate the efforts of our facilities team (especially Liz Chandler) to stay on top of these issues. We are discussing options for managing these expenses including loans, funds from our endowment, a capital campaign, or a single year budget push. No decisions have been made in this area; if members have suggestions for how we might manage these large expenses, please share those thoughts with an elder (or the entire Session) in conversation or writing.

The Session approved a motion from the Personnel Team to establish a Sabbatical Policy for non-clergy, director-level staff. We are delighted that Rebecca will be able to take advantage of a sabbatical opportunity this summer after all of her years of service at Grace Covenant. We also approved a building use form which all non-GCPC groups which use Grace Covenant will be required to complete. Regular users (i.e. woodworkers, AA) will be able to complete the form seasonally and not for every individual use.

The nominating team is currently in the process of calling our next class of Elders. Please prayerfully consider whether God is calling you to serve Grace Covenant in this way for the next year. While it is a challenging job, it is also very rewarding.

As always, feel free to talk to any member of Session if you have thoughts about the governance of our congregation.

Generosity Team Update - What the Future Holds

The generosity of Grace Covenant continues! As we come to mid-May we have seen an increase in submitted pledges from 103 to 114. We are not quite 40% of the way through the year and we have received 48% of the pledges, which is amazing. We give thanks for those who pay all or most of their pledge at the beginning of the year, but we are just as grateful for the continued generosity throughout the year.

As we move into the summer months, please don't forget about giving of your time, talent, and treasure at Grace Covenant Presbyterian Church. Generosity is about the spirit in which we live our lives in response to the love God has given freely to us. This community has been generous in the first 39 years of ministry and continues to be so today and for whatever the future holds.
